"POTATO KING" DEAD

Kinji Ushijima, commonly known as George Shima, who was recognized as "potato king," died at 5:53 a. m. yesterday, at the Hanemann Hospital of Pasadena. Mr. Ushijima took a trip to that city on March 9 before going to visit Japan with his family after a long period of residence in California. There he suddenly became ill of apoplexy and later caught pneumonia complications. During his life time, he had done much to reclaim extensive marshy lands near Stockton which the white men failed to see of any agricultural value. By his sheer force of energy and far-sightedness, he became one of the most prosperous farmers of the West. He was until his death the president of the Japanese Association of America. He is survived by widow and two sons and a daughter.
