JAPAN (Editor's Note: Fletcher S. Brockman has sent one of his San Francisco friends such a remarkable account of John R. Mott's recent visit to Japan that we take pleasure in reprinting it serially.)

III The critical hour in the life of Japan had something to do with giving wings and power to Mott's message. Japan is threatened with a Bolshevist invasion; it has not recovered from the sorrow and shock of the earthquake disaster; it is still deeply grieved and humiliated at the "affront" of the United States Immigration Act.

LAFACADIO HEARN'S NEW BOOK PUBLISHED IN JAPAN

A collection of hitherto unpublished lectures by Lafacadio Hearn has just been printed in book form by the Hokuseido, and is now being circulated in Japan, according to a recent report. The collection was compiled by Professor Ryuji Tanaka, who was one of Hearn's own students at the Imperial University, Tokyo, more than a score of years ago.

The new collection includes notes on the shorter forms of poetry; poems about children; fairy stories; and poems on death. Notes on Byron, Keats, Hood, Wordsworth, and Bridges are also included. Poems such as "Three Silences," "Sand of Dee," "West London," "Dover Beach," and "Sea Limits" are reviewed.

TEN COMMANDMENTS FOR THE NATIONS

A new decalogue, designed to promote the essentials of world peace, has been placed before the State Board of Education by the Women's Christian Temperance Union of California, with the request that it be pasted in every public school throughout the State. No action has as yet been taken on this request. Following is the unusual decalogue, as submitted by Mrs. H. Josephine Shute, of Woodland California, director of the W. C. T. U. section on peace and arbitration.

- 1—Love the Lord, thy God, and other nations as thyself. 2—Honor the Fathers and Mothers of other nations, remembering that human nature and human love are universal. 3—Thou shalt not kill and thou shalt not war, which is wholesale murder. 4—Thou shalt not steal, and thou shalt not shield thine own citizens who are guilty of international misdeeds. 5—Thou shalt not take advantage of weaker nations or races of people. 6—Thou shalt not covet the wealth of other nations. 7—Thou shalt not bear false witness against other nations by lying propaganda. 8—Thou shalt welcome students and visitors from other nations with Christian fellowship. 9—Thou shalt not promote strife or plan war. 10—Thou shalt not learn war any more.

NEW WIRELESS AERIAL TORPEDO ACQUIRED BY BRITISH

The British government has acquired an aerial torpedo which can be operated by wireless, according to a recent dispatch from London.

Captain Allen J. Roberts, an Australian, invented this torpedo, which can be operated over a radius of 100 miles. The new invention is said to be a missile with small wings, similar to an airplane.

Japanese Arms Envoy Given Free Hand

Baron Matsuda, minister to the Netherlands, will represent Japan at the preliminary disarmament conference to be held in May, and he has been instructed to support any agenda promising to be successful, according to an announcement made by the Tokyo Foreign Office last Thursday.

Japan is not opposed to the plan of the United States for a separate land and naval parity, according to the Foreign Office's announcement, reiterating a former statement.
