## TOKYO

The wide-awake weekly entitled "Time" gives us the liveliest account we have anywhere seen of Japan's new Premier. Describing the recent stormy session of the Japanese Diet, this account thus introduces Reijiyo Wakatsuki:

Above the squabbling undersized Deputies towered an old man, six feet in his stockings, who is still the amateur jiu-jitsu champion of Japan despite his 60 years. As a schoolboy he won the same title in archery, fencing, running, rowing, tennis and baseball. After graduating "summa cum laude" with a law degree from the Imperial University at Tokyo (1892), he entered the Imperial Department of Finance as one of its lowest clerks, quickly vaulted to the complete superintendence of the Tax Bureau and was sent to Paris, London and Manhattan after the Russo-Japanese War (1904-05) to negotiate loans for reconstruction and refund the Japanese war debt—in all of which activities he was phenomenal-ly successful.

"Returning to Japan, he was rewarded by the late Prince Katsura, founder of the Kensei-kai (the present Government party), who made him Vice Minister of Finance but allowed him entirely to determine the policy of that department while he held the title of Finance Minister as a mere adornment to that of Premier.
