EDITORIAL

BRIDGING THE BAY

WITH sixteen applications for franchises to bridge the bay already before the San Francisco Board of Supervisors the hopes of the citizens of the Bay region seem likely to be fulfilled within a reasonable time. Mayor Rolph declared before the Board a few days ago that "the ultimate development of San Francisco and all Central and Northern California is involved in the matter of adequate transportation between the hinterland of California and the wharves over which the products of the States are shipped to all parts of the world."

Professor Charles Derleth, Jr., dean of the College of Civil Engineering, University of California, representing the Cities Bridge Company, gave the following estimate before the Board of Supervisors: Highway bridge for vehicles only, \$25,000,000. Bridge for electric trains and vehicles, \$68,000,000. Bridge and tube for vehicles only, \$42,000,000. Bridge and tube for electric trains and vehicles, \$79,000,000. Bridge and tube for steam railroads,

Professor Derleth further declared that there is practically no cause for apprehension on account of earthquakes and that his company is "ready financially and otherwise, to build any type or size of bridge that this board may desire on the location that the company has proposed." Such a report is highly encouraging. The Board's hearing will undoubtedly bear fruit, and the cornerstone of the bridge will be laid within the next few years. San Francisco's march of progress, unhindered by the shackles of water barrier, seems to be assured.

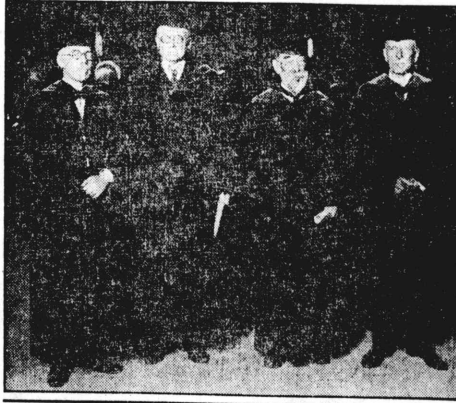
An interesting movement was set before the young students in Japan last March. The nature of this movement was to bring Japan and the United States of America into closer relationship, not through diplomatic channels but through young students of Japan. Diplomats have no doubt a great deal to do in bringing nations to a mutual understanding, but they are not by any means the only satisfactory agents for the mission. What is lacking in official relationships of the countries must be supplied in one way or another if a real international understanding is to be had; and this was thrown upon the shoulders of young students in Japan, who are going to be the guiding pillars of the country in not far distant future. In order to carry out this great idea a preliminary movement was started this summer.

This undertaking, which embodies this great idea of bringing two nations closer together through young people, especially through students, had struck me forcefully, and I became very enthusiastic in the movement, especially when I thought of the fact that I had the dearest feeling towards America. It is an undeniable and regrettable fact that America and Americans do not know Japan as much as the Japanese want them. Is this not a wonderful opportunity then for young Japanese to come to this side of the Pacific to see the things of America and understand the heart of her people with unprejudiced mind?

Believing him to be one of the outstanding educators and Christian statesmen of the Island Empire, Dr. Blaisdell was delighted to secure him as a lecturer at Pomona College. At the College Commencement that year the degree of LL. D. was conferred upon Dr. Ebina in company with two distinguished American citizens, Mr. Henry M. Robinson of Los Angeles, member of the Dawes Reparation Commission, and Mr. George White Marston of San Diego, well known California philanthropist, and President of the Board of Trustees of Pomona College.
