JAPAN MERMAN DEFEAT HAWAII CHAMPIONS IN TOKYO AQUATIC MEET

One World Record Shattered in First Day of Meet

Japan Sweeps Day With 24 to 7 Score; Hōchi Shimbum Is Sponsor

Tokyo 7—Japan swept to a decided victory in the first day of the swimming meet held under the auspices of the Hōchi Shimbum. The score was:

Japan 24; Hawaii 7. The sensation of the day was the shattering of the world's record for 400 meter back stroke event by the Hawaiian champion, Keoloha, by the mark of 6 minutes 1 second.

Another surprise of the day was the establishment of a new Japanese record for 200 meters breast stroke. The feat was accomplished by Yoshiyuki Tsuruta in 3 minutes: 0.2.

Hawaii Coach Makes Comment:

Dad Center, Hawaii's most eminent swimming coach, who had seen Japan's best men in action previously, had declared that Nipponese have gone in strong for the water sports, and they loom as formidable rivals of Uncle Sam's aquatic men. The Nippon coaches have developed a crawl leg drive affording more power than American's.

One hundred meters free style: First, Takaishi (one minute). Second, James Wood. Third, Nakamori.

Four hundred meter back stroke, ex-

tra number: First, Keoloha (6 minutes 1 second), establishing new world record. Second, Harris.

Four hundred meter free style: First, Tokuei Sada (5 minutes: 20.2).
