\$9 IS VALUE OF PUPIL
AT SCHOOL ONE DAY

Pupil Out of School Earning Less Than \$9 a Day, Losing Money

According to a statement issued by Lewis B. Avery, assistant superintendent of schools, every day spent in school pays the pupil nine dollars on his improved capacity to earn when he enters the world of business.

The wage worth of education is being studied in the night schools of Oakland with the aid of a leaflet issued from the school department.

This leaflet shows that uneducated laborers earn on the average of \$500 a year for forty years. High school graduates earn on the average of \$1000 for forty years.

The pupil who stays out of school to earn less than \$9 a day is losing money, not making money, according to the publication.

The Americanization and evening classes of Oakland enrolled 7174 students. More than \$700,000,000 is spent annually in the United States to make its citizens capable of governing the country and of earning the prizes of education.
