SAN DIEGO YOUNG MEN ORGANIZE TAIKU-KAI

Opening Celebration To Take Place On October 17; Jujitsu Exhibitions To Be Featured

Interest for sport has flourished among the Japanese of the San Diego district. Young men have taken a special interest in the art of jujitsu, and a group of them have recently engaged Kawaiishi, who is sojourning in the district, for instruction in this Japanese art of self-defense. Kawaiishi is a holder of fourth rank in jujitsu, and under his guidance the young athletes of the locality are vigorously practicing to master the art.

On the 17th of this month a taiku-kai (physical culture society) will be organized by the young men of the district. According to present plans, several jujitsu experts from Los Angeles will be invited to the celebration to inaugurate the new club, to take place on the same day. Amateur jujitsu matches as well as expert exhibitions are planned, and among the notables to be in attendance will be Consul Ohashi. A committee of 35 is actively making the necessary preparations. Membership of the new organization will number approximately 50 sport-lovers.

4 MORE BOXERS FROM JAPAN ARRIVE IN S. F. ON SHINYO

Fighters From Imperial Boxing Club To Make Debut Shortly

Another group composed of four boxers arrived in San Francisco from Japan on the N. Y. K. liner, Shinyo Maru, October 10. The boxers representing the Imperial Boxing Club of Tokyo, are Sadayuki Ogino, 27 years, 118 pounds; Kyugoro Kimura, 19 years, 115 pounds; Shigetomi Sato, 23 years, 126 pounds; and Takeo Yoshimoto, 29 years, 103 pounds; who traveled across the Pacific to learn the ways of American fighters.

Prominent American boxing promoters of Northern California have asked the Japanese manager of the quartet to stage several fights in San Francisco or Sacramento in the near future and although the Japanese boxers' intention was to devote at least three months of rigid training at Los Angeles before mixing in any bouts, the latter have agreed and negotiations are now under way for a fight between some Americans and the Japanese.

The Japanese boxers are training at the Taussig training quarters, 312 Leavenworth Street.
