U. S. TO SEND 200,000 DOLLS TO TOTS IN JAPAN

Berkeley Girl Reserves Exhibit Dolls, Their Share Toward World Friendship of Children

Two hundred thousand dolls, American-made and dressed by the hands of the American high school girls, will be sent to Japan early next year as messengers of good will and friendship among children. In this movement of world friendship among children, the Berkeley Girl Reserves are doing their share in collecting dolls, big and little, but all typically American dolls, which were placed on exhibition for a review by the Reserve members, Monday, October 25. These friendly messengers are to be dressed in typically American dresses to carry suitcases, doll-size, with various articles of an American girl's wardrobe. The money for the purchase of dolls and outfit is to be earned or saved by the girls themselves.

Movement Is Work of Federal Council of Churches:

This wonderful method of showing a kindly spirit and promoting closer relations between the children in America and Japan is the work of the committee on world friendship among children, a part of the Federal Council of the Churches of Christ in America.

The dolls are to be distributed to the Japanese children at the great doll festival on March 3. The day is known as "Hina Matsuri," when every little Japanese girl is the center of the household, and all the dolls belonging in the family are arranged on a special stand.

According to a letter received by the Berkeley Reserves from Mrs. James Tracy Richards of Saratoga, formerly a charter member of the University of California Y. W. C. A., the movement was looked upon with so much approval by educators that it was hoped the matter would be taken up in the schools themselves.
