Watch Massachusetts

Massachusetts, President Coolidge's home state, is in the political limelight. Senator William M. Butler, "Silent Cal's silent partner," is running for the United States Senate against David I. Walsh, veteran Democrat, who is conducting a vigorous campaign and giving the administration forces reasons to be uncomfortable.

It was due to this uncomfortable-ness that Calvin Coolidge issued a manifesto Monday, urging the people to vote for Butler, who is the chairman of the Republican National Committee and right-hand man of Cal's. The Boston Post made the announcement with the headline:

"Coolidge comes to the rescue of Butler."

That partly explains the President's action.

Before Coolidge's letter was made public, Butler's prospect was not too rosy, and a considerable gloom dampened the Republican camp. Walsh, Butler's opponent, is a vivid politician and a vigorous vote-getter. In 1924 he ran against Gillette, then Speaker of the National House, and was defeated only by a slim margin of 18,588 votes in an aggregate of more than one million ballot. This was in the year when Coolidge's plurality over Davis in Massachusetts was more than 400,000.
