High Figures and High Prosperity

The wave of prosperity that is gladdening the hearts of one hundred ten million people of the United States may be termed a stupendous blessing. Despite the cotton and wheat situation, this country is enjoying an unprecedented prosperity; and when compared with poverty stricken nations of Europe Uncle Sam is like a multi-millionaire by the side of a beggar boy.

Of the four thousand six hundred million dollar war debts to the United States, Great Britain has been able so far to pay \$642,830,000 in principal and interest. The surplus of two private corporations in the United States this year exceeds that amount by one hundred million. The United States Steel Corporation, whose surplus exceeds \$500,000,000, decided yesterday to distribute \$234,000,000 to its stockholders. The Standard Oil Company made a profit of nearly \$200,000,000 and the last quarterly distribution of dividends amounted to \$61,166,456, or \$19,062,297 more than was paid to shareholders in the same three months of last year. Another example is that of the Woolworth Company, which is capitalized at \$100,000,000, sells five, ten and fifteen-cent goods and hands back \$165,000,000 worth of new stock to its shareholders.

If these figures are not convincing, a glance at our savings for the fiscal year will be enlightening. A billion and a half dollars increase in America's saving banks in a year, a growth of nearly

110 Story Building In New York Will Tower 1,208 Feet

CONDITION OF EMPEROR CONTINUES TO BE GRAVE

Tokyo's Four Big Theatres Closed on Account of Emperor's Illness

Tokyo, Dec. 18.—(Teikoku Tsushin Service to Japanese American News)—The latest official bulletin issued 6 p.m. to-day at Hayama, where the Emperor of Japan is confined to bed in a critical state, shows that his Majesty's condition continues to grow worse, with the extension of catarrh of the lung. The bulletin places the temperature at 38, pulse 124, and respiration 25. Saltwater injection was administered again this forenoon at eleven o'clock.

The four big theatres of Tokyo, namely, the Imperial, Kabuki, the Ichimura, and the Embujo Theatres, decided to close their doors out of respect to the Emperor on account of his illness. The Imperial Household Department and the Emperor's Chamberlain continue to receive numerous letters and tokens of sympathy from all parts of the Empire.

JAPANESE BOXERS FIGHT AT FRESNO

Kawata Outfights Kid Kopecks; Takahashi In Draw

Two Japanese boxers fought their way through in the ring on Tuesday evening, December 14, at the Civic Auditorium of Fresno, and neither met defeat. They were K. Kawata and Y. Takahashi. The former outfought his opponent in a decision bout, and the latter pounded through a draw decision.

The following is the statement from a Fresno newspaper:

"Kid Kopecks of West Fresno fought a poor defensive battle and lost the decision to K. Kawata of Japan. The blond boy had a slight edge in the first and Kawata took the next five rounds with a continuous onslaught of blows which had a telling effect on Kopecks, who apparently was in poor condition. There was nothing left to do but to award the fight to the Japanese boy, yet some of the fans let loose a chorus of unnecessary boos."

"The curtain raiser had all the earmarks of a fast main event when George Foy of Taft put up a strong defensive battle to a debatable draw decision with Y. Takahashi of Japan."
