JAPAN SOME DAY MAY SINK INTO SEA SAYS U.S. SCIENTIST

Continuous Earthquakes May Be Cause of Disaster, According to Dr. Noble

Dr. L. F. Noble of Los Angeles, who was a delegate to the Pan-Pacific Science Conference held in Tokyo last month and who with other delegates returned to San Francisco recently declared that, according to his opinion, Japan ultimately may sink from the face of the earth.

"There is little likelihood of such a disaster occurring within the next hundred thousand years," said Dr. Noble, "but if the periodical earthquakes the country has been subjected continue, there is some reason to believe that Japan at some remote day pass from the face of the globe."

According to Dr. Noble, the bottom of Sagami Bay at Yokohama sank from 200 to 1000 feet as a result of the last earthquake, and this he said, was the greatest change noticed as a result of the tremor.

CONDITION OF EMPEROR IS SLIGHTLY BETTER

Premier Voices Thought That Japan's Ruler May Recover; Dignitaries Keep Motors Running for Emergency Call

Tokyo, December 19, (Special dispatch)—A ray of hope came to the people of Japan to-day when the announcement was made that Japan's eminent physicians who are in attendance at the bedside of the Emperor gained encouragement by successful indications of their efforts.

The official bulletin on the condition of his Majesty the Emperor of Japan issued to-day at noon places the temperature at 37.6, pulse 120, respiration 24.

The policemen at Hayama are strictly regulating the movements of the residents in order to better direct the stream of official vehicles that are pouring into the town, while dignitaries who are occupying nearby houses are keeping their motors running at the gates in readiness for the momentarily expected call.
