EDITORIAL Japanese Immigrants Welcomed in Brazil

Leaders in Japan are looking with keen interest to the brisk movement to send immigrants to Brazil. There are 40,000 Japanese living in that country at present, and this number is being rapidly augmented by new arrivals. In the year 1915 about 5,000 Japanese went there, and 1926 witnessed about 7,000. It is expected that at least 8,000 will follow them this year. The Brazilians welcome these Japanese immigrants, according to reports from the press, and there is no reason why such acceptable immigration should not be encouraged, especially in view of Japan's problem of surplus population.

200-Miles-an-Hour Auto Ride
