Six California Swimmers May Race in Pan-Pacific Championship

Osaka "Mainichi," Japan's great newspaper, has arranged for the first annual Pan-Pacific Swimming Meet at Osaka, from August 5 to 10, this year.

Preliminary arrangements for the big meet were made last November at Baltimore at the annual meeting of the Amateur Athletic Union, when a representative committee of the A. A. U. about permission to have six California swimmers, preferably members of San Francisco Olympic Club, participate in the Pan-Pacific meet.

S.F. SHOWA CLUB CAGEMEN WINS CLOSE BATTLE OVER TUNG CHI QUINTET; 25-20

Contest is Toughest and Most Exciting Game; Tung Chi Put Up "Tong Man" Like Offense To Vanquish Showa; Endo and Ogawa Stars

Again the San Francisco Reformed Church Court was the scene of two desperate battles, for on Friday night, January 28, the Showa basketball artists smeared the "Grant Avenue" quintet to a 25-20 victory. On the same evening, the diminutive Tung-Chi five trimmed the San Francisco Y. M. B. A. lightweights by 28-14 count.

From start to finish the score never exceeded two goals on either side, and occasionally the unguarded Chinese broke loose and thrilled the entire audience with cold chills down their spinal column.

GAME IS UNCERTAIN FROM START TO FINISH:

No one had the least idea as to who would be the victors of the game except the confident Showa's red blooded warriors who were determined to win or commit "hara-kiri."

For some period of time the ball was juggled up and down the court, favoring no side; just then Showa's most worthy guard, "Dink" Hasegawa, shot the prettiest little basket which gave the Grant Avenue boys the rheumatism.

The game proceeded in this fashion until at the end of the first half the Showa boys were nosed out by a slim margin of 7-8 score.

The five minutes seemed entirely too long to wait for vengeance, but our old friends, "Nebo" Endo, "Toby" Ogawa and

Shig Saito appeared on the scene, accompanied by much exaltations from the audience. They took the positions of Sakai's center, Ueyeda's forward and Mayeda's forward, respectively.

The Showa five certainly were "ra-ra" to go when they started the third quarter, "Nebo" Endo and "Toby" Ogawa instantly amassed four precious points apiece.

EDITORIAL

Kellogg's Manifesto To China

In contrast to the antagonizing tactics employed by the State Department in dealing with the situation in Nicaragua and Mexico, Secretary Kellogg's statement of our position in China is manifestly written in the right tone. The communication, issued to the people of China rather than to the Chinese Government for the reason that there is no de facto government representing entire China, is merely a confirmation of the policy formulated by John Hay and followed by his successors. While it establishes no new precedent or policy, it nevertheless commands interest. The salient point is embodied in the words:
