Tokyo, March 19.—The conscription bill was unanimously approved today by the committee of the Upper House of the Imperial Diet. The bill is designed to amend the national conscription law as to make it unnecessary for citizens residing in foreign countries to make yearly application for exemption from military service. The bill has already passed the Lower House, and the favorable report of the committee in the Upper House makes the passage of the bill in that chamber practically assured.

The following are the players of the two teams and number of points made by each:


