EX-PREMIER WAKATSUKI TO BE ELECTED HEAD OF NEW POLITICAL PARTY

Takejiro Tokonami of Seiyuhonto Party To Be Chief Adviser

Special to the Japanese American News TOKYO, April 29.—The new political party, to be formed by the coalition of Kensei-Kai, Seiyuhonto, and Shinsei Club parties, will elect former Premier Reijiro Wakatsuki as its president, it was disclosed today.

After being defeated by the Alameda Taiiku Kai nine, the Waseda University team was given a cordial welcome banquet at Alameda Tuesday evening. The members of the Japanese varsity returned to San Francisco the same night and put up at the Whitcomb Hotel. The following day, Wednesday, was spent in shopping in this city and visiting points of interest. After an uninterrupted series of games and banquets the college boys were glad to avail themselves of this "off-day" of liberty.

In the afternoon of the same day, at 3 o'clock, the party left for Fresno. Among those who went to see the boys off at the Townsend depot was Mr. Wolter, Stanford coach, who had so materially assisted in giving the boys a warm welcome. They arrived in Fresno at 10 o'clock that night.

After defeating the Fresno Taiiku-Kai nine by 12 to 3 score on Thursday, the Waseda boys proceeded to Los Angeles, and they reached the Southern metropolis yesterday morning. They will play two games with the University of Southern California, April 29 and 30.

After the games in Southern California the invading collegiates will tour the East, returning to San Francisco by way of Seattle and departing for homeland on the N. Y. K. liner Siberia Maru, which sets sail from this port on June 21.

American Tourists to Japan

Japan's usual quota of foreign tourists, particularly Americans, will be considerably reduced this year, according to statements from the Japanese Government officials. The reason for this is found in the trouble occurring in Shanghai and interior China.

By all rights of logic, Japan should have more tourist trade than she usually enjoys, and should attract at least as many American tourists as is enjoyed by Europe, Japan and the Orient possess historical traditions as rich as those of Europe. The scenery of Japan is at once grand and beautiful, while from the standpoint of picturesque sights she outstrips all Europe.

But the fact that Japan enjoys only a small percentage of American tourist trade all goes back to the inferiority and superiority complexes of the American people. For more than a century America was impressed with "superiority" of Europe. To be cultured one must travel and observe the cultured civilization of the Old World. On the other hand, the Orient was generally regarded only as a place of strange sights and more or less inferior people. To the average tourist, a European tour was necessary for culture, while a trip to the Orient was an extravagance.
