## PRINCE CHICHIBU MAY MARRY AMBASSADOR T. MATSUURA'S DAUGHTER

Ministry of Imperial Household Issues Official Denial

TOKYO, May 1.—It is rumored that an understanding has already been reached for the engagement of H. I. H. Prince Chichibu and M's Setsuko Matsuura, daughter of Ambassador Matsuura.

The Ministry of Imperial Household, however, issued today a denial of the rumor. Although they are several candidates for the honor of becoming Princess Chichibu, says the statement, the final decision will be made only after the end of the period of Imperial mourning now being observed in honor of the late Taisho Emperor.

## Prominent Party Leaders Protest Against Coalition

TOKYO, May 1.—Considerable opposition is being voiced against the proposed coalition of the Kensei-Kai, the Seiyu-honto and the Shinsei Club parties to form a new opposition party.

Hajime Motoda, prominent party adviser, together with thirteen other members, withdrew from the Seiyu-honto party as a result of the proposed alliance. Another prominent figure who left the Seiyu-honto for the Seiyu-Kai is Teiichi Sugita, a member of the House of Peers.

Mosuke Kahara and Gohe Matsuura (vice-chairman of the Lower House) are also expected to leave in the near future; consequently the Seiyu-honto party has been considerably weakened.

## OAKLAND KENJIN-KAI HAS GREAT OUTDOOR PICNIC ON THE ALBANY HILLSIDE

\$350 Worth of Prizes Are Given Away to Winners of Contests

On Sunday, May 1, a "dal-do-kai," sponsored by the Oakland Kenjin-Kai, was held on the Albany hillsides, starting at 1 o'clock in the afternoon.

The first feature of the "dal-do-kai" was the "mochi-fukubiki." Hundreds of hard, round "mochis" were thrown out from two corners of the field and a wild scene ensued as everyone struggled frenziedly to procure them.

First prize of this "mochi-fukubiki" was a fifty dollar gold watch won by a man from Alameda. The second was a sack of rice; third, a "shouy-daru" and, fourth, canned goods.

Races were next in the order of the day, and a 300-yard run was won by Frank Kawakami, who received a Parker Duofold fountain pen.

Another long race of 600 yards was won by Nobuo Tabata who also received a fountain pen.

Besides these races, however, there were very many others for "kodomō, fujin, and seinen."

A unique contest was a "fujin-no-leelay" in which many women ran in their silk stockings (it was fortunate that they ran on grass). Another "howler" was a "soap" race in which every racer had to balance a cake of Crystal White on his head for at least 150 yards.

"Ichi-nin-kyaku" and "nim-nim-sankaku" were full of hops and spills and many a pair of "jumpers" jumped out of turn to come to grief.

The "kei-san kyo-soh" was a mathematical hurdle of running and trying to add three columns of figures at the same time.

The concluding event of the afternoon program was a "baseball-basketball" game in which the girls were given red, cotton-stuffed baseballs, and the boys, the white ones. After about fifteen minutes of red and white balls flying all around the sky for the two wire baskets attached on ten-foot poles, the boys won, having run twenty-three "cotton bags" to the twenty-two by the girls.
