EMPEROR IN UNIFORM OF GENERALISSIMO OPENS SPECIAL SESSION OF DIET

Government Submits Three Measures To Lower House

TOKYO, May 4.—The opening ceremony of the fifty-third special Diet session was conducted in the House of Peers at 11 o'clock of the forenoon yesterday. His Majesty the Emperor of Japan, dressed in full uniform of "daigenshi" (generalissimo), read the message before all members of both houses, who remained standing throughout the ceremony.

The Government today submitted three bills to the Lower House. The first one demanded approval for the recently proclaimed Imperial moratorium. The second bill provides for giving relief to the Bank of Taiwan. The third provides for the ordering of emergency loans to Japan Bank under governmental guarantee against possible loss incurred by the bank.

Communication Minister To Mediate N.Y.K. Strike

TOKYO, May 4.—The long pending strike of the Nippon Yusen Kai-sha stewards is expected to be settled this evening by the mediation of the new Minister of Communication, Keiji Mochizuki.

It is intimated that the differences between N. Y. K. and the strikers will be settled through compromises, including the understanding for reappointment of strikers who were recently dismissed.


