OPPOSITION PARTY WILL PRESENT IMPEACHMENT AGAINST PRIVY COUNCIL

Passage of Resolution To Raise Constitutional Question

TOKYO, May 6.—The proposed bill to impeach the Privy Council for its interference with the action of the late Wakatsuki Cabinet will be put into a resolution form and introduced into the Diet by the new opposition party, which is a coalition of the Kensei-Kai, the Seiyuhontou, and the Shinsei Club.

COUNCIL RAISES IRE OF DIET MEMBERS

The passage of this resolution by the Diet will raise an unprecedented constitutional question. The Privy Council, which is an advisory board to His Majesty, the Emperor of Japan, is composed of veteran statesmen who are appointed for life by the Emperor at the recommendation of the Premier.

The Privy Council conducts its business in secret session, and is composed of twenty-four regular members besides the three honorary members who are H. I. H. Princes Chichibu, Takamatsu, and Kaini. The youngest member of the Council is K. Hirayama, 61 years old, and the eldest member is Viscount T. Ishiguro, 83 years old.
