Spinning Mill Strikers Conduct Demonstrations

TOKYO, June 18—Lively skirmishes are going on between the operators and strikers of the Dai Nihon Spinning Mill of Senju.

The strikers, consisting of 3,500 men employees of the mill, are demanding redress of grievances, which include right to join labor union and recall of some fifteen expelled labor leaders.

The operators have struck barred wire barricade outside of the mill, thus cutting all communication between girl spinners within and the strikers outside of the building.

In order to retaliate this action, the strikers marched under the dormitory windows of the girl spinners and conducted a labor demonstration to win their sympathy, singing song of exhortation to the join the strike.

Army Plane To Hopoff For Hawaii In July

What promises to be an exciting race to accomplish the San Francisco-to-Hawaii flight is now going on briskly, and the latest development is the announcement of Assistant Secretary of War Davidson that a giant Fokker plane will attempt the flight within six weeks. The plane, now on its way to San Francisco from Dallas, Texas, will be piloted by Lieutenant Lester Maitland, holder of world's unofficial record of 281 miles per hour at Wright field some time ago. The plane possesses a gross carrying capacity of 12,715 pounds, and it will carry a load of 1,100 gallons of gasoline, which is estimated to be sufficient to propel the plane 1,000 miles beyond its destination.

Another air pilot, with the announced intention of flying from Hawaii to San Francisco, has left this port for Honolulu on the Matson liner, Manukai. His name is Richard Grace, Los Angeles movie aviator, and his airplane, which accompanied him on the ship, is of the same type as that of Lindbergh's "Spirit of St. Louis" which successfully accomplished the trans-Atlantic flight. Of course, the production of the wool is in ratio to this percentage of sheep production. In California alone eighteen million pounds are produced each year, equaling 7 percent of the 254 million pounds produced in the United States, and it is evident that the substantial proportion of the total amount produced is represented in the extreme western states.

The larger share of this western wool production is shipped East in most cases the movement being before it is scoured and cleaned. This in itself represents a substantial transportation burden as over 60 percent of the weight is in dirt and grease which is removed by a scouring or a cleaning process.

Los Angeles is admittedly the proper location for a wool center but despite the facilities and advantages surrounding the location only about four one-half million pounds of wool enter the City annually and about one-half of this moves on to Boston.

From an economic standpoint it can be easily recognized that the West in moving this western wool to the East Coast for scouring and manufacturing into the finished product, then moving these products back to the Pacific Coast to supply the consumer, Coast manufacturers should be developed to eliminate this waste. Above that point indications are that eventually a textile center will result through which the finished product will be distributed to world ports and the Atlantic seaboard.
