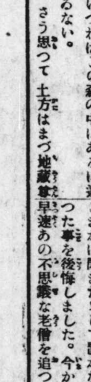

CONFERENCE OF FAR EASTERN QUESTION TO CONVENE ON JUNE 27

Japanese Policy Towards China Is Conference Subject

Special to the Japanese American News TOKYO, June 25—The government's Far Eastern Conference, after many postponements, will at last convene on June 27. It will be held in the official residence of the Foreign Minister Tanaka (who is also the Premier).

Guichi Tanaka, who had been ill for the past few weeks with throat complications, has recovered sufficiently to enable him to open the conference, for which Minister Yoshizawa and various consul-generals and consuls have been recalled from China.

CHINESE SITUATION TO BE DISCUSSED

The opening day of the conference, after the formal speech by Premier and Foreign Minister Tanaka, will be devoted chiefly to the exchange of views on the Chinese situation by the various consuls and consul-generals. It is agreed, according to reliable intelligence from official sources, that the biggest question to come up before the conference will be the deciding of the time for the withdrawal of Japanese troops from Shantung.

It is generally conceded among the statesmen that Japanese troops should be withdrawn as soon as disturbance in Shantung peninsula has quieted sufficiently as to no longer menace Japanese lives and property. Despite this general agreement on principle, it is expected that disagreement will occur on details of withdrawal, as consular representatives to Northern and Southern China have diversified views on the subject.

Today, Minister Yoshizawa called at the official residence of the Premier and conferred with I. Hatoyama, chief secretary of the Cabinet.

Government Negotiates Loan for Kawasaki Co

TOKYO, June 24—The Kawasaki dockyard, which is now experiencing financial distress as a result of the recent bank panic, has appealed to the government for assistance, and the Tanaka Cabinet succeeded in negotiating with the Kogyo Bank a loan of 30,000,000 yen for the Kawasaki Company under the government guarantee.

Members of the board of the directors of the bank, after a conference, demanded not merely political promise but a legal contract to bind the guarantee. This the Premier refused to do, as it would require the sanction of the Diet, and another modified proposal was sent to the Kogyo Bank by the Finance Minister today to supplant the previous unacceptable one.

The Livestock Situation

Pertinent Facts on Recent Development

An important element in combining feeding of livestock with the range production has been the economical maintenance of soil fertility in the irrigated sections and this element is being recognized, as it has proven itself in the Middle West. A considerable amount of educational work is being done in the West along these lines and noticeable progress is being made. It is a fact that the concentrates grown in the West such as barley, milo, and kafir have as great a fattening value as those produced in the Middle West and many times are grown more economically.

Then, too, the Southwest particularly has access to large amounts of cottonseed cake and meal which has a high feed value due to the amount of digestible protein which it contains. Many range producers are using cotton cake by spreading it on the range to supplement the grass ration and it has proven an excellent conditioner where the grass crop is poor or weather conditions such as to make grazing difficult, a few pounds of this feed taking the place of a large amount of forage.
