IMMIGRATION QUESTION IS CENTER OF DEBATE AT PACIFIC INSTITUTE

Japanese Deplore Manner in Which Exclusion Act Was Passed

HONOLULU, July 28—Declaring that "Japan does not demand the privilege of sending its surplus population to America, but resents openly the offensive manner in which the Gentlemen's Agreement was abrogated by the United States," Mr. Akira Ishii, one of Japanese delegates, expressed the conviction of Japan before the Institute of Pacific Relations now in session here...

Taking issue with the views of the Japanese delegates, Paul Scharrrenberg, San Francisco labor leader, declared: "Diplomats have filled the Pacific slope with Asiatics. In the early days of the United States they should have taken steps to prevent the influx of Orientals."

"I believe the brotherhood of man here in Hawaii is lopsided. The average wage of Oriental mechanics is three to five dollars a day and for whites, five to ten dollars. We are working hard to prevent a duplication of that on the Coast. I am sorry we have had to be unpleasant at times to do it."

IMPERIAL SQUADRON OF JAPAN ARRIVES IN S. F.

Training Squadron Commanded by Rear-Admiral Nagano; Cruisers Iwate, Asama Sail into Port on Thursday Afternoon at One O'clock

Gliding serenely and gracefully like floating palaces, the two cruisers of the Japanese Imperial training squadron steamed into the Golden Gate amid the roar of gun salutes on Thursday afternoon, at one o'clock (one day ahead of the schedule).

The Iwate dropped anchor off pier No. 36, while the Asama was stationed off the East Bay shore. Naval and civilian officers then boarded the flagship to extend welcome courtesies to the commanding officer. The Japanese delegation included representatives of the Chamber of Commerce, Japanese Associations, and others.
