RANDOM THOUGHTS By Yamadori

"Metropolis"

Floating rumours waiting across the continent had proclaimed the "Metropolis" as a "stupendous" picture. On viewing this movie production last night, I found it mildly impressive only pictorially, and that only in parts; while dramatically it is a puerile melodrama, with an ocean of meaningless mob movements.

Scientifically it is a stupid fantasy woven without a single element of logical imagination to render it even remotely plausible.

The drama has to do with an imaginary city of the future, presumably of a considerably remote age to come, judging from the vast difference of its scene and the picture of a metropolis of today. An intellectual dictator rules over this future city, and he binds the vast population into mechanical slavery. These denizens of the underworld workshop plot to revolt, but they are discovered before the catastrophe occurs. Masterman then instructs his scientific wizard, Rotwang, to construct a mechanical homo sapiens, in the likeness of a heroine who is leading the revolt. Instead of following the instruction of its creator, this feminine robot instigates the labored mass into desperate ferocity. They strike at the city and its creator, and attempt their demolition, when the hero and heroine come opportunely to avert the disaster.

The first proposition suggested by the picture is the probability—or the improbability—of an overcrowded humanity massed into an underworld shop bound to mechanical drudgery. Before the advent of birth-control, it was excusable to conjecture that humanity will multiply itself eventually to a point of intolerable saturation. But such a conjecture, at this time when we can glimpse the immense possibilities of scientific birth-restriction, is a stupid absurdity. This sort of imaginative bugaboo was shattered, or should have been blashed, two decades ago.

Scientist Declares 'Okyu' Relieves Nerve Troubles

TOKYO, August 2—Third Scientific Conference was held yesterday in Northwestern Imperial University Auditorium in the city of Sendai. Professor Ohira of Kyushu University announced that "okyu", or moxibustion (cauterization by means of moxa), has good effect on nervous prostration and hysteria.

Professor Fukushi of Tokyo Imperial University declared that

human body is so constituted that it is capable of warding off all forms of disease except tuberculosis and syphilis by producing within itself anti-toxin to combat them. He declared that for this reason all patients other than those afflicted with tuberculosis and syphilis need not go to physicians for relief.

It is conceivable to picture the time when machine age will ultimately reach that point of efficiency requiring no labor at all except such work as demanding play of intellect to direct mechanical energies. Such a world of efficiency has a tendency toward over-production, which could be alleviated by restriction, allowing much leisure for the mass of the people for intellectual and social advancement.

There are other absurdities, but they will be evident to the man in the street. This German film is decidedly disappointing and does not rank with its more illustrious predecessors.

20 Dead as Torpedo Boat Tokiwa Explodes

TOKYO, August 2—The Navy Office here announced the receipt of report from Admiral Kato, who is in command of the mine-laying flotilla, that the torpedo boat H.I.M.S. Tokiwa was damaged in the middle deck when its tube exploded yesterday. However, no damage was done to the engine room, and the ship steamed to Sasebo naval base for repairs by its own power. The number of casualty totaled eighty-five, including five officers and fifteen seamen dead, eighteen missing, and forty-seven wounded.


