A triangular steel rod, suspended in mid-air, was struck to keep time as we ascended the labyrinthian steps into the halls of torture. The 120 heroes of the navy who perished in the catastrophe, will be buried on September 1, at the Maizuru naval cemetery. More than 10,000 navy men will participate in the funeral.

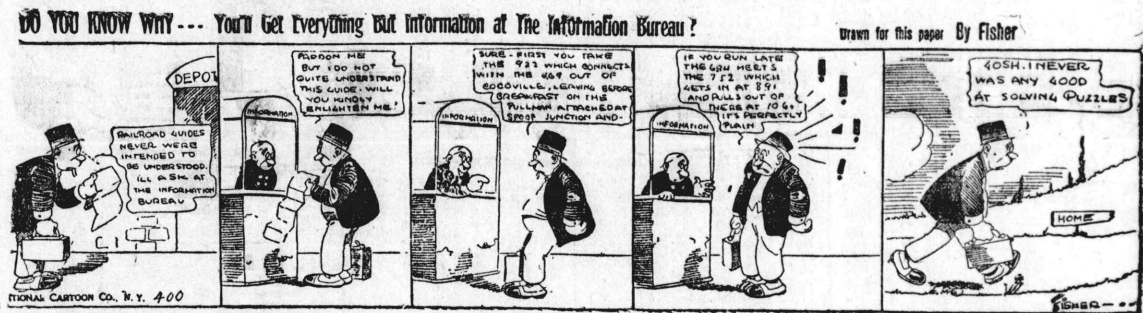
