

Inferiority Complex and The Second-Generation

There are many second-generation members who have a tendency to make evident their self-consciousness of inferiority to the white Americans. This inferiority complex is mainly due to their ignorance of the history of their own race, as well as to the influence of the equally ignorant conception of "white superiority", which tends to look down upon colored races.

Instead of being ashamed, they should be proud of their origin, for the Japanese is the only nation which has not experienced foreign subjugation. Japan accomplished in half-a-century what it took the white race centuries to achieve. Bear in mind, that there is no such thing as "white superiority", because the very claim of spiritual superiority by the Orientals can hardly be denied until a better religion is created by the Occidentals. Here, instead of "white superiority", I should suggest a more suitable phrase "white supremacy", which is a mere accident, as history shows that there have been times of Mongolian predominance. However, I admit that white skin is more beautiful than colored, but we cannot be otherwise, so just be content with a "white mind"; besides, we are not living for appearances, but for achievement.
