The Hoshi-no-Hana Club of Berkeley, California, was formed about three years ago and is composed of about twenty second generation Japanese girls. The purpose of this club is to further service and friendship among the girls of all religions.

We have many times heard of your name and of the wonderful way in which you have devoted your whole life for the happiness of humanity and we are sending these scrap books in appreciation of your great work. We want you to give them especially to the poor children who are sick or in the hospital because they cannot have the pleasures that other children are able to enjoy.
