

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RANDOM THOUGHTS

"Plain Talk"

Flaunting its wares under a golden-red cover and striking the passerby with its plebeian yet arresting title "Plain Talk", a magazine of caustic comment and satire makes its first appearance this month. It is modelled somewhat on H. L. Mencken's American Mercury. Although it is less pretentious and nearer to the comprehension of the man in the street than its more illustrious predecessor, the new monthly journal nevertheless promises to be another amusing whipping-post of the American commonality.

The first issue contains a sardonic thrust at prohibition, "Name Your Poison", by Clarence Darrow. Emil Ludwig pens a magnificent picture of Bismarck, and Will Durant writes a stimulating essay on Utopia in his "If I Were a Mayor."

Among the dozen articles that appear in the current number, perhaps the most arresting one is "A Confession Writer Confesses," by Don Knowlton. It is a "wow". Of all the "literary" phenomena of modern time, the spectacular rise of the confession magazines is the most striking, and this master confessor, who bravely admits that he confesses three souls a month for the delectation of the shop girl and the grocery man, writes a worldly wise account of the trials and joys of a professional confessor.

"Plain Talk" is both amusing and entertaining, clever rather than deep, and contains illustrations that are barbarous. Read and judge it for yourself. If you like it, you should be decorated by Mr. Mencken himself.
