MONGOLIA, MANCHURIA PROSPER

S. M. R. President Consults Tokyo Officials

TOKYO, October 27.—Bringing back a bright picture of conditions in Manchuria and Mongolia, President Yamamoto of the South Manchurian Railway returned this morning from Mukden to consult with the officials here regarding the further expansion of Japan's rail interests on the continent.

During the past twenty-five years since he first visited Manchuria, this territory has undergone remarkable improvements, Yamamoto declared to pressmen when interviewed this morning.

Conditions in Mongolia, Harbin, and Kirin are extremely good, the head of the S.M.R. pointed out. The administration of affairs in North China since the Russo-Japanese war, he continued, has been praiseworthy.

Discussing the recent anti-Japanese agitation in Mukden, Yamamoto explained that the situation has improved greatly as a result of the intervention of Marshal Chang Tso-lin and that the radical elements who fostered the demonstrations are now under strict surveillance.

JAPANESE TO ISSUE BOOK IN JANUARY?

JOHNSON NAKAGAWA MAY FAVOR EARLY 1928 RELEASE

SACRAMENTO—Friends of "Johnson" Nakagawa and others anxious to read his novel will have to wait until the new year, that is if he takes the wise advice of the publisher. Books released this December are usually included in the old 1927 list while those put out a month later will receive mention in the 1928 reviews. After the new year, books in the 1927 list will not have much appeal as a new one, so the publisher wishes to release it in the early part of next year.

If Johnson wishes, of course, the book can be published this December, but he has not decided, though it is thought that he will favor a 1928 release, as it a matter of waiting only a month or so longer. The first-run popular fictions of class "A" specification usually sell for \$2.00 a copy. Whether this Japanese youth's novel will pass the requirements for a class "A" classification remains to be seen. In a short time he will receive the final proof copy of his book. "Johnson" Nakagawa, so far as we know, is the first second generation Japanese to publish a full-length novel. His book is entitled, "The Rendezvous of Mysteries."

Californians, especially those of the second generation, should be glad that there are no such foolish questions to answer when they register. If this State had such a set of questions it is very likely that prejudiced Americans would make every effort to keep citizens of Japanese and Chinese ancestry from voting.
