DISCUSSION HELD BY FELLOWSHIP

GROUP LED BY DR. MEYERS OF U. C. DISCUSSES VARIOUS TOPICS

BERKELEY—"If the United States were to disarm completely now—do you think that any other nation would take advantage of such a situation by attacking her? I don't think so—for the common people of other nations, who have to pay the taxes for the upkeep of armaments, would literally force their political leaders to follow America's example."

Such was one of the most startling statements made by Dr. Meyers of U. C. in the discussion group held by the local Fellowship last Sunday night at the Dwight Way Christian Church.

Under the general topic of "Practical Christianity," Dr. Meyers had led three discussions on the following specific points: (1) Christianity as applied to personal conduct. (2) Christianity as applied to vocation. (3) Christianity as applied to state or world affairs.

"Do the Japanese young people have any racial prejudice? What do you think about capital punishment? What would you do if America declared war on Japan or any other country tomorrow?"

Preceding the discussion, a light supper, prepared by the mothers of the church, was enjoyed, and following the discussion, another discussion was held on the problem of assimilating into the American churches of combining the Japanese Christians of the community into a new central church. Majority of the Fellowship members were in favor of the latter course to pursue in the near future.

KEIO WILL MAKE TOUR OF U.S. IN '28

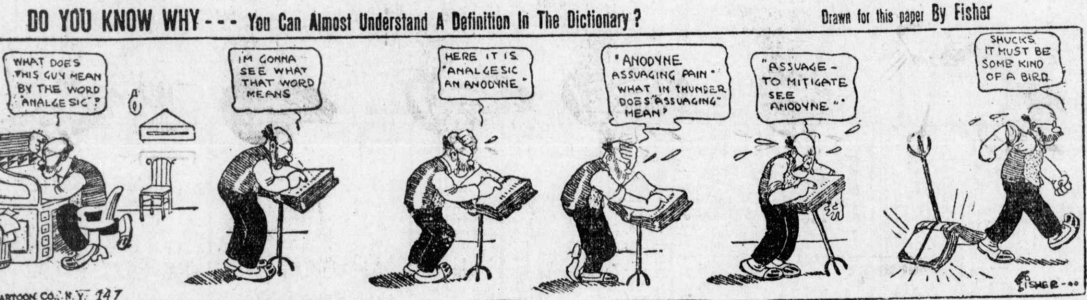
Ogawa of Wakayama Fame Registers As Tossler

The fast rated Keio University nine of Japan's "Big Six," which tied Waseda Tomon Varsity in their 1927 league season, will set sail next spring for a diamond invasion of the United States. The nine will engage in a series of games with the major universities of the Pacific Coast and with Eastern nines, according to announcements of various newspapers of Tokyo.

Besides the regular members of the present Varsity, Ogawa, who led the Wakayama High School nine through Pacific Coast invasion as wonder twirler, has signed-up on the pitching staff of the Keio's. Igawa of Takamatsu Commercial School will also twirl for the Varsity on its basebal itinerary.

The Keio University team is scheduled to remain in the continental United States for about two months, playing against various American college nines and semi-professional aggregations. On their return trip, the Keios are booked to stop in Hawaii for about a month and perform against the Hawaii League teams under the auspices of The Nippon Jiji. And following their Hawaiian engagements, the collegians will depart from Honolulu in the latter part of July for their alma mater where they are expected to resume their studies.
