PRINCE TO WED IN SEPTEMBER

Wedding Will Take Place Before Coronation

TOKYO, Jan. 20.—The marriage of Prince Chichibu, heir presumptive to the throne, to Miss Setsuko Matsudaira, adopted daughter of Viscount Matsudaira, a brother of Ambassador Tsuneo Matsudaira, will be solemnized in September this year, it is unofficially reported here today.

But Japan alone does not look to Manchuria for deliverance. So does China. Seven hundred thousand inhabitants of the Celestial Kingdom annually migrate or rather are driven from war-torn districts in the south to North China.

Thus, though primarily for her own benefit, the development of Manchuria which Japan is actively fostering today, is indirectly benefiting the Chinese. China is promising as much from Japan's work in Manchuria as Japan.

An important point to consider in this connection is that Japan, with an increase of a million a year in population, is sending no emigrants to China. She contents herself with deriving raw materials for her factories and in selling her manufactured products to the Chinese.

Nippon carries on her activities in Manchuria through the South Manchuria Railway Company. This organization is at present preparing the floatation of a loan of \$60,000,000 which will be advanced to the Chinese as a capital fund for the railway.

In order to increase the hauling capacity of the Chinese lines, the South Manchuria Railway Company is planning the construction of a number of 60-ton steel freight cars to replace the 30-ton cars now in use which will be turned over to new lines.

The new lines are being built by capital supplied by Japan, but they in no way violate China's sovereignty. They will largely contribute to the economic interests of China and Japan, and the Chinese will, according to Japanese as well as foreign observers, benefit far more from the new lines than the Japanese.

As matters stand Manchuria, through the development of railways, will be able to support a population of 700,000,000, or some 25 times as many inhabitants as dwell there today.

But China, according to the admittance of its own statesmen, has not the money to develop her railways or her territories, and no country other than Japan is prepared to advance her the necessary funds.

700,000 Chinese are migrating to Manchuria yearly. Such a rapid rate of increase is apt to cause unnecessary hardships and suffering unless the country is opened up and developed. It is obvious to China's advantage therefore to see that railways are constructed and communications in general improved so that, instead of being able to support but a few tens of millions, the saturation point will not be reached until centuries hence.

This is the view not alone of Japan, but of American spokesmen.

It must be admitted here, however, that leaders in Japan are no more altruistic than those in other countries and their primary object in advocating railway construction in Manchuria is to benefit themselves. By opening up the country in this way, not only will Japan be able to tap wide areas of hitherto undeveloped territory and thereby make the mineral deposits and products of the soil available to herself and others, but she will be in a position to sell her manufactured goods to the millions of Chinese which this territory, when opened, will attract as immigrants.

Preparation Under Way For Dinner In Kyoto

The two grand dinners to take place during the Imperial Coronation late this year will be held in Tokyo and Kyoto this time, and some three thousand guests will be invited at each of these functions celebrating the formal ascension of the present ruler.

When the late Emperor Taisho ascended to the throne, these state functions were held in Tokyo due, it was rumoured at that time, to the fact that the capital city made a strong bid for the honor to the Imperial Household Department.

This time leading Kyoto restaurants formed a service organization, and made a special request to the Imperial Household Department. The result was that Kyoto will have the honor of entertaining the Imperial guests at one of the two main dinners. Under the present estimate each plate will cost 50 yen, and the whole Empire will be raked for the best of material for the menu.

The "tai," a variety of Japanese fish, famous for its wonderful flavor, will be taken from Akashi, a district along the Inland Sea near Kobe. These "tai" will all have to measure exactly a foot in length, and will be served in the form of soup. They will also be sliced and served raw.
