THE SECOND GENERATION There is no question over which the Japanese in this city spend more time worrying today than the problem of the "second generation."

There is seldom a gathering of Japanese here in which the "second generation" question does not crop up.

The education, marriage, and occupation of American citizens of Japanese ancestry who are now rapidly maturing into men and women are the greatest questions confronting San Francisco's Japanese.

The consensus of opinion among leading Nipponese here is that their children have inherited more of the bad qualities of Japan and America than the good, and that unless efforts are exerted to curb this unfavorable tendency, a very serious question is likely to arise.

In the past Japanese subjects in this country have refrained as much as possible from instilling the culture, education and manners of their native land into their children.

The result has been, however, that the second generation is sadly neglected in so far as its Japanese training is concerned. On the other hand, their homes not being American, Japanese children have had little opportunity to live in homes in which a true American atmosphere exists.

In other words Japanese children in this city have been brought up in a way which renders it impossible for them to obtain the best that is in either the Japanese or American home.

It is said that they lack discipline, that their attitude towards their parents is one of haughtiness, and that they are themselves disappointed in life.

Fortunately most of the second generation Japanese are still very young, and it is not too late to correct their faults. It is in this respect that there is such disagreement, and consequently much discussion among the Japanese of this city today.

One faction holds the idea that teaching Japanese children too much of Japanese life will tend to retard their Americanization.

The opposing camp maintains that too much importance is being placed on the Americanization of Japanese children. They hold that it is merely American jingoists who demand that Japanese children be not brought up as Japanese.

CONSUL GENERAL IDA'S RECEPTION DATE CHANGED The date for the grand reception to be held by the new Japanese Consul General Morikazu Ida at the Fairmont Hotel has been changed from February 11 (Saturday) to February 7 (Tuesday).

Lincoln's Birthday will fall on Sunday (February 12) and the holiday will be transferred to the next day, Monday. These two rest days falling in succession will cause many people to leave their homes for week-end vacations, and this fact has been taken into consideration in changing the date for the reception of the Consul General.

The reception will be a huge affair, and already about two thousand invitations have been sent to the various prominent Japanese and Americans of this section. Some sixty second generation Japanese girls have been invited.

A large delegation of young people from the Stanford and University of California as well as from the East Bay and San Francisco districts are expected to participate. A feature of the evening will be the grand ball.

Japanese girls who possess kimonos are urged to wear them to the reception, while the boys should wear formal clothes. Those who will help receive guests will be Mr. and Mrs. Loomis of Japan Society, Mr. and Mrs. Hales of California Development Association, and Mr. and Mrs. Alexander, former president of San Francisco Chamber of Commerce.

TAXI MEN ARE DENIED LISENSSES

Japanese Affected by New City Ordinance A blow was dealt the drivers of Japanese taxis of this city when the new city ordinance forbidding operation by non-citizens was put into effect Wednesday with the result that the employees of the two Japanese taxi firms are resting pending further developments.

Vice-Consul Kaneko, upon hearing of this situation, declared that the new law vitally affects the interest of the Japanese people, and he forthwith visited the city officials Wednesday with a view to ascertaining the exact situation. The new ordinance, it was learned, was in no way aimed to discriminate the Japanese but was enacted in order to prevent a certain European group of alien drivers from involving in wild parties and using taxis for immoral purposes.

The two Japanese taxi firms affected by the new regulation are the Panama and the Golden Gate company. The former operates four taxis and while the latter possesses one vehicle. The five Japanese drivers became aware of the operation of the new law for the first time when they applied for the renewal of their licenses on February 1, and their applications were denied by the police department.

They then engaged Saburo Kido, law second generation lawyer, to take up the case and start a move to effect an amendment whereby the new ordinance will be in effect only with new applicants.

As a result of Vice-Consul's interview Wednesday with the city officials, however, it is probable that the new ordinance will be so amended that Japanese drivers will be permitted to operate as heretofore. According to those versed in international law, the ordinance is a violation of the Japan America Commercial treaty whereby Japanese residents are guaranteed the right to pursue trade unmolested.

Inasmuch as treaties take precedent over city ordinances, this new taxi driver regulation is unconstitutional, it is believed. In support of this contention, it is pointed out that the ordinance passed by the city of Seattle interfering with the operation of billiard parlors by Japanese was declared void last year.
