Japanese Victims Rushed To Hospital

STOCKTON, Feb. 22—Four Japanese residents near here were injured when the car driven by Shirokubo turned over on its way to Stockton early Tuesday morning.

The four unfortunate victims of the accident were rushed to the Emergency Hospital, and they were later removed to the Sister's Hospital.

While some of the victims were severely injured, their condition is not fatal, according to the attending physician.

Japanese Divots Play Fine Golf In Tourney

Outclassing a field of more than 1000 divot experts in the Bulletin-Emporium's final golf tournament reeled off last Saturday and Sunday at the Lincoln Golf Course, A. G. Sato, local Japanese turf specialist chalked up a low score of 74 and held seventh place to qualify for further matches in the second flight, but was unable to qualify for championship.

George Ritchie, the Northern California golf champion, and Dr. Jack Wolf, the present holder of the Bulletin-Emporium championship tied for first honors finishing the round in 67. 113 strokes were registered against M. Galloway who footed the list of players.

Sato is a member of Kasumi Golf Club of this city and is recognized as a leading golfer of the State, capturing the L. A. Japanese American News golf trophy in a fiery two-day Japanese All-California Golf tourney held in that city some two weeks ago.

Dink Hasegawa, another young Japanese golfer and a member of the local Showa Athletic Club finished the course with 89 attempts, just one more stroke above Rube Wolf, who wields a wicked club on the stage of the Warfield Theatre.

JAPANESE ROUTS 6 ROBBERS

Man Startles Thug With Pointed Pistol

LOS ANGELES, Feb. 22—A Japanese storekeeper repulsed a robber and his five accomplices single-handed late Sunday night, 11 o'clock, at the Bunmeido Book Shop, 123 1/2 North San Pedro Street, of this city.

The burglar, seeing only one customer in the store, entered alone. Kuroda, who became aware of the intrusion, quietly crawled behind the counter and obtained his pistol from the back of the store. He then returned to the cash register unobserved, stooped behind the counter, and suddenly thrust the revolver forward when the robber approached him. He then forced the intruder to the sidewalk.

YAMATOS BEAT MONROE NINE


