TOKYO'S BUS CONDUCTRESSES

Perhaps the most unique feminine vocation in Japan today is that of the bus conductress. One does not find her counterpart in the United States, Great Britain, France, Germany, or anywhere else. By far and large, Japan's bus conductresses are in a class by themselves.

They begin on a 50 yen (\$24) monthly salary basis. This seems a very small amount for a person to receive for working from eight to ten hours a day for thirty days, with working hours from 6 o'clock in the morning until midnight, depending on the "shift" on which one is placed, but in Japan it is considered a fairly good salary, despite the fact that the cost of living is almost as high in Nippon as it is here.

Fifty yen a month is just about the amount received by a university graduate during his first year at almost any sort of occupation. Eighty per cent of the university graduates in Japan, in fact, aren't able to command even this much. Or anything near this amount, for that matter. It takes most graduates a year or more merely to find a vacancy.

Stick Out Arms

But to return to our conductresses. These hard-working girls don't merely punch tickets and collect fares. That, in fact, is the least of their duties. They stick out their arms at all intersections to give passing motorists the necessary traffic signals, and they must memorize the names of nearly a thousand stations, which they call out to the passengers.

But this is not all. The majority of Tokyo's 1,000 bus conductresses are required to stand for the greater part of the day. They must naturally also look after discourteous and intoxicated passengers, the latter of whom in Japan are treated with special politeness.

According to a recent survey conducted by the city officials of Tokyo, the majority of conductresses who lose their positions do so because of illness. This is confined almost exclusively to tuberculosis. Standing in stuffy, over-crowded buses and perpetually breathing gas fumes, does not do one's lungs any good, least of all a girl's.
