FRESNO, April 30.—(Special)—Rivaling in sheer beauty and attractiveness the most gorgeous and stateliest of Fresno's sumptuous and magnificent floats in the pompous annual Raisin Day parade here yesterday, the Japanese floral float, bearing Miss Etsu Kawata, queen of Nippon, won lavish praise from the multitude of spectators who lined the route of the parade as thousands of Japanese from outlying counties cheered their country's entry.
