HIROSHIGE

With Hokusai, Harunobu and a few other noted Japanese color print artists of the Eighteenth Century when art flourished in Nippon, Hiroshige ranks among the greatest artists in the history of the world.

And yet this genius of the brush, in his youth, was not regarded sufficiently accomplished to be appreciated by the then popular Toyokuni, and thus obtained his training under the guidance of Toyohira who ranked next to Toyokuni.

Drew Tokaido Prints

It was here that he drew his world famous 53 color prints of the Tokaido, the route between Tokyo and Osaka.

Hiroshige was born in 1795 and died in 1858. He was one of the principal members of that branch of the Ukiyoe, or Popular School of Painting in Japan, a school which chiefly made color prints.

His family name was Tokitaro Ando; under that he is known having been, in accordance with Japanese practice, adopted by him in recognition of the fact that he was a pupil of Toyohira.

Highly Valued

Some of Hiroshige's original paintings are valued today at tens of thousands of dollars. Many of his works have been purchased by Americans and Europeans and are to be found in several of the world's greatest museums.

On the death of Toyohira, his master, Hiroshige began to practice on his own account, but finding small encouragement at Yedo (Tokyo) he removed to Kyoto, where he soon returned to Yedo, where his work soon became popular, and was imitated by other artists.

Hiroshige died in the Japanese Capital at the age of sixty-two, and was buried at Asakusa. One of his pupils, Harunobu, received from him the name of Hiroshige II, and another, Ando Tokubei, that of Hiroshige III. All three were closely associated with the work signed with the name of the master.

Works Of Great Merit

Hiroshige II some time after the year 1863 fell into disgrace and was compelled to leave Yedo for Nagasaki, where he died; Hiroshige III, then was called Hiroshige II. He died in 1896. The earlier prints of these artists, whose work can hardly be separated, are of extraordinary merit. They applied the process of color block printing to the purpose of depicting landscape, with a

## MAN LEAPS TO DEATH TO BE URGED
