### THE JAPANESE SWORD

The Symbol of "Heiho"

(Continued from yesterday)

"The art of war that I have acquired by years of training and study, I now desire to put down in the form of a book. Since a teacher I have given my thoughts to the study of the art of war, and at the age of thirteen I had my first trial. My opponent was Arima Kiyoshi, Master of Shinto-school of fencing, but I came out victorious. At sixteen I won over the famous strong man, Akiyama, of Tajima, and at the age of twenty-one I came up to the capital, and since then I encountered many masters of the country, but I defeated all comers. Furthermore I travelled through most of the parts of the country and met masters of the various schools, and sixty odd contests were fought but I never lost a fight. That was between the age of thirteen and twenty-eight or nine. As I looked back at the age of thirty, I did not win the previous contests because of my superior art of war, but either because I had natural ability or my opponents were at fault. Later I studied daily and trained myself in order to attain the deeper principles, and it was when I was fifty that I became able to understand the art of war. As I write this book I do not use the old words of Buddha or Confucius, nor those of ancient war records and books. To explain the principle of truth is the aim of this book."

### The Gorinsho.

Gorinsho (Book of five Wheels) is divided into five chapters of Earth, Water, Fire, Wind and Void.

In the first chapter of Earth, he tells the fundamental principle of the art of war. He says: "Heiho is the code for Bushi. Many Bushi do not understand the true code of Heiho, and they know only how to die—Heiho is the code to train men to become superior in everything. Heiho is not restricted to the use of swords; it is a training to enable us not to be bettered by others in any respect. To become superior to others is to win, to control and to lead others. It does not mean such a narrow minded idea as defeating others by use of a sword. It means to win victory by the exercise of mind and body. One has to become superior in conducting oneself properly, in observing the etiquettes of the society in giving proper administration to


