1 KILLED, 6 HURT AS CAR OVERTURNS

15-Month Old Baby Dies, Mother Is Near Death

One person was killed and six others seriously injured late Sunday night 10 miles from Salinas when an automobile driven by Ki-jiro Ichijui of Pacific Grove overturned and pinned its occupants beneath it.

The dead: Lucy Ichijui, 15-month-old child of Mr. and Mrs. Ichijui, instantly killed.

The injured: Mrs. Ichijui, seriously hurt. Unconscious since the mishap.

Ki-jiro, Jr., oldest son, James and Teru, third and fourth sons, Kazumi, eldest daughter, and George, second son, sustained minor injuries and were brought to Monterey.

The Ichijuis called on friends at Santa Cruz Sunday and were hurrying to their home in Pacific Grove late at night when the mishap occurred.

Sacramento Slayer Takes Life In Park

SACRAMENTO, June 11.—(Special)—Kuntaro Maruyama, aged local resident who shot and killed Tohei Inoto, a friend of his for more than 18 years, late last week, and who subsequently was being sought by police, committed suicide early this morning in Southside Park.

Miss Kakutani arrived here late last week aboard the N. Y. K. liner Siberia Maru to study classical Occidental dancing. She is a famous actress in Japan and is one of the highest paid actresses in Japan. Her dancing is classical.

Miss Kakutani pointed out that American dancing is perfectly suited as an after-dinner diversion. As for modern American stage dancing, this may be good exercise, but there is nothing in it that can be called art, the noted Nipponese artist declared.

BOY RESCUED FROM BLAZE

Fire Threatens Japanese Section of City

HONOLULU, June 11.—(Special)

The arrival early tomorrow morning here of Miss Setsuko Matsudaira aboard the N. Y. K. line's Shinyo Maru, is being awaited here with unusual expectancy.

The entire city will join in extending to the future Princess Chichibu of Japan a warm welcome as these isles have accorded to any personage.

To Crowd Waterfront. Thousands of Japanese residents are expected to crowd the waterfront as the stately Shinyo Maru moves into her berth sometime early tomorrow morning.

The Matsudairas will probably be taken off the Shinyo Maru off-port and transferred to a naval gig which will convey them to the navy's pier.

The party will then proceed immediately to the Japanese Consulate on Nuuanu street. Here Ambassador Matsudaira will receive prominent local Japanese and American residents.

The Matsudaira party will remain in the city until late in the afternoon when the Shinyo embarks for Yokohama on the final lap of her voyage.

ABOARD THE SHINYO MARU, June 11.—(Special)—Miss Setsuko Matsudaira was in excellent spirits last night and attended the showing of motion pictures of H. I. H. Prince Chichibu, her fiancé.

The Prince was portrayed climbing the Japan Alps. The picture was enjoyed by all aboard.

The Shinyo will probably remain in Honolulu a day before proceeding to Yokohama.

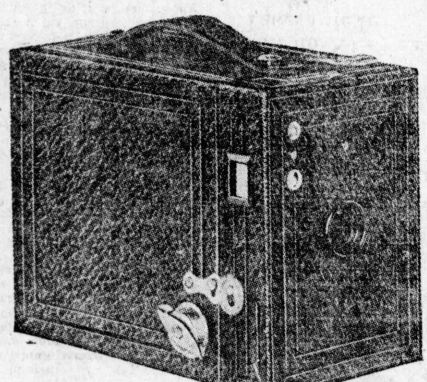

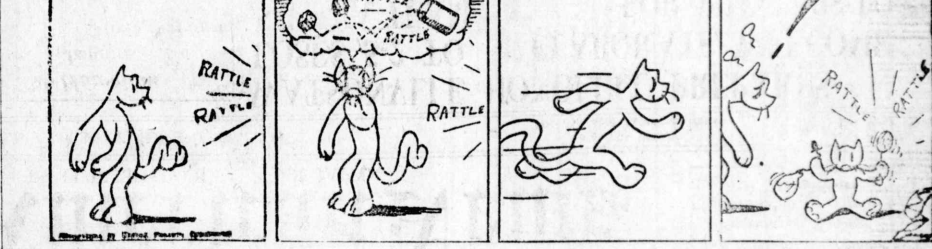
