NIPPON IS COUNTRY OF MANY BOOKS

250 Monthly Periodicals in Japan Says Noted Writer

KOBE, Nov. 16.—(By Mail)—That the Japanese people were the greatest readers in the world was the conviction of E. F. Jenkins, chief of the parliamentary staff of the Cape News, Capetown, South Africa, who since last June has been touring the world. In his various observations, reading of books and magazines by little children on the streets, in the train cars, and in almost every place they were seen, was a source of much surprise as well as admiration to him.

NUMEROUS MAGAZINES

"I have been astounded at the numerous publications of monthly magazines and daily newspapers," he went on to say. "In my limited observations I have counted as many as 250 monthly magazines. There must be many of which I do not know, in which case the total number must be enormous. Japan in this respect must be the leader of the world in her publications. This speaks for the zealous love of her people for literature."

GENERAL IMPRESSIONS

Speaking of his other impressions of Japan he told the reporter, that he was particularly impressed by the universal courtesy of the people, the exquisite and wonderful scenery of the country, the energetic character of the nation's industry, and the general progressiveness of the Japanese subjects. He then pointed out in complimentary phrases the rapid recovery Tokyo and Yokohama made, but was somewhat dismayed about its streets being untidy. This he felt would be remedied when the great building programs of the two cities were completed.

KEEP OLD VIRTUES

"It is well that the nation is adopting so many things of the West," he said, "but for heaven's sake do not pervert the inherent virtues of the Oriental civilization," he pleaded. "If you become too westernized your country will lose its virtue. Right now there is much to recommend to prospective travelers to come to Japan." He then added with hesitation, but your hotels charge a little too much.

NEW LANGUAGE URGED

Jenkins was keenly interested about expenses in this country, the wages of the laboring class, and also the progress of English. He favored Japan adopting English as her universal language. "Japanese is nothing but Chinese anyhow which is a borrowed language," he said, "she must borrow why not borrow something new and practical. Why look at all the ease it will bring to students and the expense it will cut down in publication," he exclaimed.

Tokyo To Hold Exhibition of Rare Paintings

TOKYO, Dec. 11—Tokyo people will be treated to a rare collection of famous old Chinese pictures according to Lieut. Gen. Sakanishi, former military adviser to the Peking government, who has gone to Shanghai from Japan to enlist the efforts of National leaders. General Chiang has consented to be patron of the exhibition of Chinese pictures in Tokyo. The collection will be displayed at the Tokyo Imperial Museum and Art Gallery.

PRINCE IN PILGRIMAGE

Pays Respect Before Tomb of Emperor's Late Tutor

TOKYO, Dec. 11—(Special)—Prince Kanin, general in the Japanese army and one of the most brilliant members of the royalty, today paid respects to spirit of Jugo Sugawara, late tutor of the Emperor while he was still a crown prince.

Much interest is attached to this act of Prince Kanin, who represented the ruler in this pilgrimage, as it demonstrates the great esteem with which the Emperor regards his late teacher, who was one of the outstanding figures of his time. As a scholar, patriot, and a great exponent of the Bushido or the way of the Samurai, the late Sugawara had exerted much influence over the present ruler.

Gifts from the Emperor were sent to the surviving members of the family of Sugawara.

MAN KILLED AS MACHINE STRIKES BUS

One Other Japanese Hurt In Franklin Canyon Crash

CONCORD, Dec. 11—(Special)—Noboru Hayashi, 26, a window washer for the Santa Fe Company at Richmond, was killed, and his companion, Tamotsu Henmi of Danville was seriously injured last night when their Dodge car driven by Henmi, crashed in a head-on collision with a huge stage bus that was passing the grade crossing at Franklin Canyon. The accident occurred about half-past nine o'clock.

Hayashi, who is well known among the sumo fans as the amateur wrestler who goes under the name of Minatogawa, had attended a court trial in Martinez in which he was one of the plaintiffs of an auto accident case which occurred last February. Against the advice of his friends, he resolved to go home to Richmond last evening after the court session. His friend Henmi consented to take him home.

Following the crash with the Portland bound bus, Hayashi was rushed to a hospital in Richmond, where he died at midnight. Henmi was taken to an Oakland hospital, where he is suffering from injuries in the forehead and legs. He will recover.

CHINA SENDS INVITATION TO HOOVER

Nanking Representative Invites Him At Lima

LIMA, Peru, Dec. 11—(Special)—A gesture of friendship which may later prove the beginning of a happy international relation is seen in the action of the Chinese National government, which today extended president-elect Herbert Clark Hoover an invitation to visit China.

The invitation was made by an official representative of the Nanking government. Hoover, having been a resident of China for several years, is expected to pay particular attention to the affairs of the Far East, and the Chinese people believe that his administration will prove a blessing in aiding China reach an economic and political stability following the turmoil of Nationalist revolution which has just come to a nominal close.

TOKYO, Dec. 11—(Special)—Because her father spent so much money in drinking bouts and caused the suffering of her mother and little sisters and brothers, Haruye Ito, an eighteen-year-old girl who lives in the Asakusa amusement district, today killed her father and gave herself up to the police.

The Asakusa district assembly was immediately convoked in a special session today, and the assemblymen unanimously passed a resolution recommending clemency in her prosecution, as she was motivated by a noble purpose in committing the crime.

JAPAN HIT BY COMPETITION

Britain's Artificial Cotton Weapon for Trade

LONDON, Dec. 10—Besides the activities of the newly organized Eastern Textile Association, which will back up the Lancashire mills to compete with the Japanese in China, the satisfactory result of the test of the newly discovered artificial cotton has proved that Lancashire has added another powerful weapon to compete with the Japanese cotton industry.

The artificial cotton is being grown in England to produce an annual crop sufficient in quantity and also quality to meet the demand of the Lancashire and Yorkshire mills. The present crop of about 4,000,000 pounds which is now being raised in the southern part of England will be available next July at a fixed price of 6 pence per pound, which means an immediate saving of 4 pence per pound for the cotton industry.

The test proved that the yarn can be blended just as ordinary cotton with artificial silk or wool, taking most delicate dyes, absorbing less than one-third of the amount of dyes employed in the present process.

The discoverer is an English chemist named Walters who happened to notice a bird making a nest with cotton-like material in British Guinea. He brought back the seed and root and planted it successfully in England.


