SCORES KILLED AS STORM HIT NORTHWESTERN JAPAN; 20 TOWNS ARE INUNDATED

Niigata Prefecture Bears Brunt of Fierce Blizzard; 519 Houses In Five Prefectures Demolished In Gale

LONDON, Jan. 4.—An Exchange Telegraph dispatch from Tokyo today said that the death toll of gales and tidal waves in the Niigata area had reached 150.

TOKYO, Japan, Jan. 3.—Several hundred houses were reported destroyed, 56 persons killed and scores injured by storms on the Honshu coast, southwest of Niigata. Information reaching the railway department here today was that at least 20 villages were inundated by the high seas yesterday.

Niigata is on a sandy strip of land at the mouth of the Shinano river. There are canals in the center of the streets to assist traffic. Tea is grown throughout the district and there are oil wells in the vicinity.

KUMAMOTO, Japan, Jan. 3.—A severe earthquake was felt throughout the province of Kyushu yesterday morning and destroyed several houses. There were no casualties.

The epicenter was 25 miles northwest of the Asosan volcano, which has been showing signs of activity.

TOKYO, Jan. 4.—(UP)—Seven persons were killed and 26 injured by a blizzard which swept northwestern Japan yesterday, an official announcement today said.

The casualties were in the prefectures of Niigata, and Toyama. Five also were missing in Ishikawa prefecture, the announcement said. Earlier unofficial reports said 72 had been killed, 40 of them in three Niigata villages.

Twenty-four persons who were aboard the steamer Toyotomi Maru which went aground off Nagasaki still were missing today, the official announcement said. Early reports reaching here said four of the crew of 35 swam ashore when the ship grounded and six bodies were recovered.

The official announcement said 519 houses were demolished by high winds in five prefectures. Ten feet of snow, the heaviest in history, covered the city of Sapporo.

COURT FINDS BOY SLAYER TO BE SANE

Yutaka Fukunaga Will Face Execution On February 2

HONOLULU, Jan. 3.—Myles Yutaka Fukunaga, kidnaper and slayer of 10-year-old Gill Jamieson, son of a Honolulu bank official, is sane the territorial Supreme Court decreed today, upholding the Circuit Court, which sentenced the Japanese to hang for his crime.

Unless Fukunaga's counsel appeals to the Federal courts he probably will be hanged February 2, at the expiration of the Governor's second reprieve pending action of the Supreme Court.

Eighteen Sacramento Japanese Gridders Will Invade Fresno for Great Football Clash Sunday Afternoon at Ball Park

FRESNO, Jan. 4.—(Special)—With the football field all cleaned and with sturdy goal posts set up, ready to receive the familiar oval-shaped pigskin, the husky eleven of the Fresno Young Men's League is impatiently awaiting the arrival of the well experienced Sacramento players to engage in the much-looked-for tussle on Sunday afternoon, June 6.

The game is scheduled to start at 2:30 at the Japanese ball park. The Sacramento will send a team of 18 players, who will leave the Capital City on a special bus Saturday noon from Fourth and O st. The Fresno Y. M. A. squad got together on Wednesday to polish up on their signaling under the capable guidance of Coach Ermin Ginsburg.

The ticket sales were reported to be coming along fine. However, by far a larger number must be sold to clear the expenses, and the fans, especially the second generation, are requested to back up the team and see the game.

Miss Yolando Kusakabe, Graduate of Santa Cecilia's Royal Academy, Will Render Compositions by Japan Composers

Fresh from her triumphant tour of Japan, where she was everywhere greeted with enthusiasm by the musical critics, Miss Yolando Kusakabe, pianist of international note, will give a recital in this city Sunday evening, in the auditorium of the local Kinmon Gakuen school on Bush street.

It was through these pieces that she was first heralded in the land of the Cherry Blossoms as an artist of first rank. "Harusame" or "The Spring Shower," which she will interpret, was composed by Yamada, one of the most popular as well as the most distinguished contemporary composers of Nippon. The other piece is entitled, "Echigojishi," and was composed by Sawada.
