A rescue squad of 150 men are now engaged in digging out the train. No fatal injuries are reported.

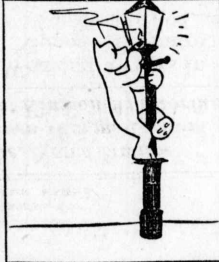
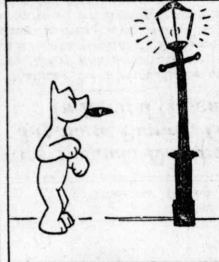
IS ALL ROUND ATHLETE
