## FRESNO FIVE WILL CLASH WITH SHOWA

### Game Scheduled At Community House Saturday Night

One of the biggest games of the season and undoubtedly the most important one for the Showa locals will be reeled off Saturday night at the San Francisco Community House court when the husky sons of the Samurai meet the Fresno Templars, last year's champion, in what is expected to be a lively tussle.

This will be the first major game for the Showas in the home court. They will invade Fresno for the return game in late February.

Having won the undisputed right to the mythical state championship by its victories over U. C. and the San Francisco Y. M. C. A. in 1928, the Fresno Boys are again making a strong bid for the title. Because they make but occasional visits to this part of the country, they are a great drawing card. There is, however, a special interest attached to the local fans for this game, as they are just waiting to see just what kind of a showing the Showa boys make against these sole conquerors of the 'Y' team.

### STRENGTH WILL BE KNOWN

The Showa and the Y. M. C. A. admittedly the two strongest teams in the city, have never been able to get together to decide the all important question of athletic supremacy, and there is much discussion as to which has the better team, but until such time as they can settle their superiority on the court, their ed by their respective showings against such teams of proven strength can only be judged as Fresno.

Although the game Saturday may prove much it will not be a conclusive indication, as the relative strengths of the teams concerned may have shifted in a year's time. With added practice, and smoothness of play that comes from close association with each other, it is easy to believe that they are even better than ever. Showa will have Manager Nakamoto, Bee Uyeda, Hayashi, at forwards, Nanbu and Sakai at center, and Bo Uyeda, Moriya and Saito at guards, all familiar faces but all of them improved with age.

It promises to be a war of a game, a "natural," and if you are wise, you will heed the warning, "come early and avoid the rush!" Admissions are 50 cents, children 25 cents.

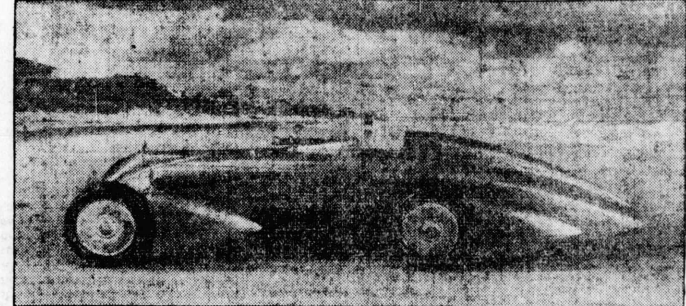
## Nippon Announces Names of Delegates To Geneva Conclave

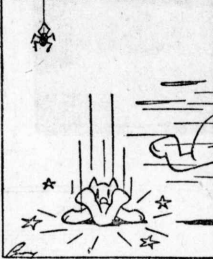
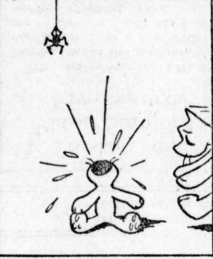
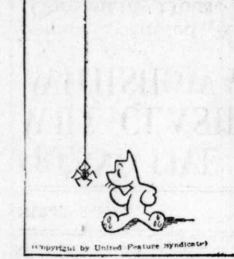
