### China Rebels Make Inroads In Shantung

Chefools Threatened; Japan Consul Gives Proclamation

PEIPING, Feb. 27.—(Special)—A formidable anti-Nationalist revolt in Shantung, headed by three powerful Chinese warlords, threatens to cause serious set-back to the aspirations of the Nanking government today when the rebel armies invaded Chang-chiu, while Chefoo, an important seaport, was also near collapse.

The three rebel generals, Sun Chuang-fang, Chu Yu-fu, and Chang Tsun Chang, are making considerable inroads against the forces of Pai Chun-chi, Nationalist chief, who has dispatched a battalion of troops toward Tsinan today to prevent that city from falling.

### ANTI-NATIONALIST WAR

Chang Tsun Chang, who is perhaps the most powerful warlord among the rebels, telegraphed a proclamation in which he declared to the nation at large his intention of conducting a comprehensive anti-Nationalist war in Shantung.

Japanese Consul Fujita, stationed at Tsingtao, made an official proclamation in which he forbade all forms of violence within the area guarded by the Japanese troops. He declared that no mobilization of Chinese troops there will be allowed, and all traffic in arms will be stopped by the Japanese officials. All Japanese caught involved in these Chinese intrigues and disturbances will be deported at once by the Japanese government, Fujita further averred.

### PARLIAMENTARY FORM OF GOVERNMENT IN NIPPON

By L. G. MASUI

(Continued from yesterday)

In the first place, it is clear that parliamentary government has secured a permanent place in the life of the Japanese people. About five or six years ago it seemed as though our labor would refuse to participate in the nation's politics, but the adoption of universal manhood suffrage turned the table in favor of political participation by the general mass, and proletarian parties have sprung up one after another since that time.

The interest shown by our labor justifies the belief that Japanese labor would form a ministry of its own earlier than American labor would elect a President from among its own rank and file.

Love for political liberty and self-government has been too deeply implanted in the hearts of the people during the past forty years of our parliamentary experience to allow the admiration of some of them for Mussolini or Lenin to assume an institutional expression.

Secondly, Japan's constitutional progress is in the right track at present, thanks to the wise judgment of Prince Kinmochi Saloni, the Genro, who advises the Throne on the matter of the selection of new premiers upon the resignation of a cabinet. Socialists, radical propagandists and unenlightened foreign critics may connect the Seiyukai cabinet with plutocratic power within the country, but the selection of Baron Gichi Tanaka, the president of the Seiyukai, as the successor of ex-premier Reijiro Wakatsuki, in 1927 was a political incident of vast importance when viewed from parliamentary conventions. Until that time, the establishment of a cabinet unsupported by a party was possible; a statesman having a great personal prestige and financial power could form a ministry even though he had no connection with any party.
