TOKYO, April 11—(Special)—Commemorating the fifteenth anniversary of the death of Shōken Kotoku, Imperial consort of the late Emperor Meiji, some 40,000 subjects of Tokyo today visited the Meiji Shrine. The figures only include those who visited the shrine up till noon.

The vast grounds of the Meiji Shrine are today enveloped in a cloud of cherry blossoms and present a picture of unparalleled beauty. Vast multitudes are congregating about the shrine to view the blossoms and appreciate their delicate tint.

Japan Will Find Means of Preserving Art Treasures of Nara Civilization Kept in Store House For 1200 Years

TOkyo, April 11—(Special)—All the resources of scientific Japan will be placed at the disposal of the newly created Imperial committee to preserve the ancient and historic treasures lying in the famous Shoso-In, the treasure house built during the Nara Era some 1200 years ago.

The committee, appointed today to preserve the relics from the ravages of time and decay, is headed by Teijiro Sekiya, vice-Minister of the Imperial Household Department. Eleven others are also on the committee.

DIFFICULT TASK

Within the spacious Shoso-In, declared to be the oldest wooden structure in existence, lay artistic art objects which are rapidly being consumed by decay. The kimonos, for instance, are so threadbare and fragile with the effect of time that the least disturbance turns them to ashes. The various household utensils, fashioned with golden linings and designs of great beauty as becomes the art treasures of a dazzling civilization, are also crumpling.

To preserve these relics is the difficult task before the present committee.

A year ago the wall paintings have been restored by a famous Japanese painter, Eisaku Wada, who employed various pigments and preserving compounds to take away the effect of deterioration.

It is known that Japanese eminent scholars, scientists, historians, and archeologists will be employed to effect the task of restoring this ancient Nara store house and its treasures.

The Nara period of the Japanese history is chiefly known for its refined culture. It is generally known as the Golden Age of Poetry. It was also an era of intense religious devotion. The history of the period shows that several Emperors left their secular rule for the monastery. A striking feature of the age was also the number of Empresses who ruled the land. It was an age of elegance, refinement, and an almost feminine love of beauty, particularly in poetry.

WATSONVILLE, Apr. 10—"Buddha and Child," a three-act play which was staged by the members of the Y. M. W. B. A. was the feature of the big celebration of Gautama Buddha's 2500th birthday at the Toy Hall at which were 300 spectators.
