112 BELIEVED DROWNED AS JAPAN SHIP STRIKES ROCK AND SINKS OFF HOKKAIDO

Warship and 2 Liners Rushed to Scene of Grim Sea Mishap 97 RESCUED

DISASTER BELIEVED DUE TO RAGING STORM WHICH HIT ENTIRE NORTH JAPAN

TOKYO, April 23—(UP)—It was feared today that 112 persons had been lost when the steamer Toyokuni Maru, carrying 209 persons foundered in the Bering Sea off Kamchatka Monday.

Two Japanese steamers, responding to the Toyokuni Maru's SOS were reported to have rescued 97 of the 209 aboard, comprising crew and passengers, who were returning fishermen. Reports of the rescue differed, however. A cruiser was sent to the scene from Ominato, Hokkaido Islands.

The Toyokuni's hull and cargo were said to have been insured for \$3,500,000.

Toyokuni is a Japanese steamer of 2,344 tons, built in 1886. Kamchatka Peninsula is off the north-east coast of Asia.

TOKYO, April 23—More than a hundred persons were believed drowned when the Japanese steamship Toyokuni Maru sank a few minutes after striking rocks off Cape Ermo in Southern Hokkaido.

The vessel sank so quickly there was only time to send out a single SOS.

Two steamers which reached the scene early this morning, several hours after the sinking picked up 97 persons. Two hundred and nine were known to have been aboard when the ship sailed from Hakodate yesterday.

The disaster was believed due to bad weather in the wake of last Sunday's hurricane, which was followed by a gale and a snowstorm off the coast of Hokkaido and in the vicinity of Hakodate.

Several naval craft left Ominato to aid in the search, but it was feared there was small prospect for other survivors.

The 176 passengers carried by the steamer were fishermen bound for Kamchatka, where they were to fish for crabs during the summer.

The Toyokuni Maru is a 2,344 ton craft owned by the Kitanbon Kisen Kaisha of Japan.

Terakawa Is Given Office As Minister At Stockton Temple

STOCKTON, April 23—Rev. Tokufuku, minister at the local Buddhist Temple, will leave for Europe the early part of next month, it was announced Friday evening.

Mrs. Tokufuku will not accompany the reverend, but will board the Japanese liner Tenyo Maru.

Rev. Tokufuku has been a chief pastor of the local Buddhist temple for the past four years, and he is largely responsible for the construction of the new temple three years ago.

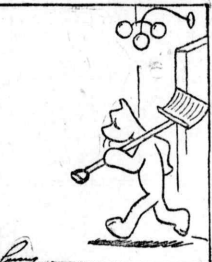
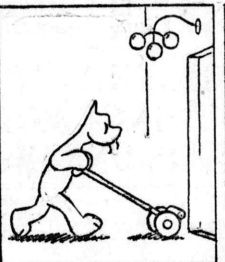

ACHIEVEMENT OF THE LATE SAWADA IN DRAMA LAUDED

The recent death of Shojiro Sawada, who is generally known by the abbreviated name of "Sawa-sho," will have far-reaching effects upon the dramatic world of this country.

The Shin Kokugeki (new national drama) which is known by a more popular name of "Kengeki"—a name now familiar to the American people—has lost its leader and it is highly doubtful whether it can find any successor who can continue Sawada's unfinished work.

The success achieved so far by the new dramatic movement was almost entirely due to the personal magnetism of Sawada, who was known for his passionate nature, unquenchable enthusiasm, purity of purpose, and devotion to what he believed to be lofty and upright. He had a perfect confidence in the ultimate success of his movement and his bull-dog determination to carry out his ideals has been an inspiration for the dramatic writers. Mr. Noboru Hasegawa, one of the popular playwrights, said upon hearing Sawada's death:

"Until this very moment I believed in a miracle—I was convinced that Sawada would never die."

GOES TO KANSAI

Sawada started his new dramatic movement in Tokyo under the guidance of Professor Tsubouchi of Waseda University in 1915 but it proved a big failure and he went to Kansai in the autumn of the same year. He then presented a drama called "Fukagawa Ondo" at the Bentenza, Osaka, and made a great
