PRINCE WILL BE FETED AT SPORT MEET

50,000 Athletes Will Demonstrate In Huge Shrine Tournament

TOKYO, May 4.—In order to welcome Prince Henry, Duke of Gloucester, who is now in this city to confer the Order of Garter to the Japanese Emperor, a mammoth athletic demonstration and tournament will be staged tomorrow at the Meiji Shrine stadium.

Applications for participation in the great tournament has been already received from 120 universities, colleges, and middle schools of this city, with a total of 50,000 student competitors promised. Other applications are now pouring in, and indications point to the biggest affair of its kind ever held in recent time.

As the climax to the tournament, there will be a game of rugby between the teams composed of sailors of the cruiser Suffolk which had conveyed the Duke and an all-star team selected from the universities in the Kanto League.

Special to The Japanese American News TOKYO, May 4.—His Royal Highness, Prince Henry, Duke of Gloucester, who arrived here to present the Order of Garter to the Japanese Emperor, today visited the Imperial University of this city and bestowed upon the institution the honorary Shakespearean medal in behalf of the Japan Society of London.

At noon the British royalty was feted at a luncheon party by Minister of Navy, Oka. The affair was held in the Japanese Naval Officers' Club headquarters at Tsukiji. In the afternoon Prince Henry was the guest of honor at a garden party held in the Shinjuku Imperial garden by the British Society of Tokyo.

The most brilliant social function of the day was held at the British Embassy this evening when he was the honored guest at a dinner party. Prince Henry conferred by distinctive honorary orders upon the Japanese Premier, Baron Gichi Tanaka, Count Shinken Maki, former ambassador to Britain and former Imperial chancellor; Baron Gonsuke Hayashi, former envoy to London; Chancellor Kikoku Ichiki; Army Minister Shintaro Kawakami; Navy Minister Okada; Kantaro Suzuki, Imperial chamberlain; and General Nara, court official.

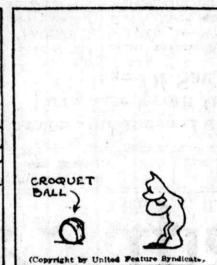
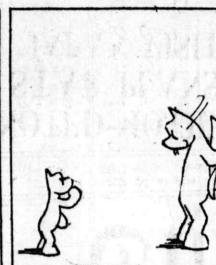
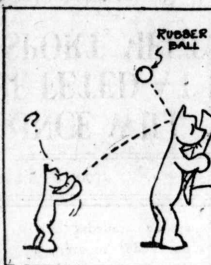
