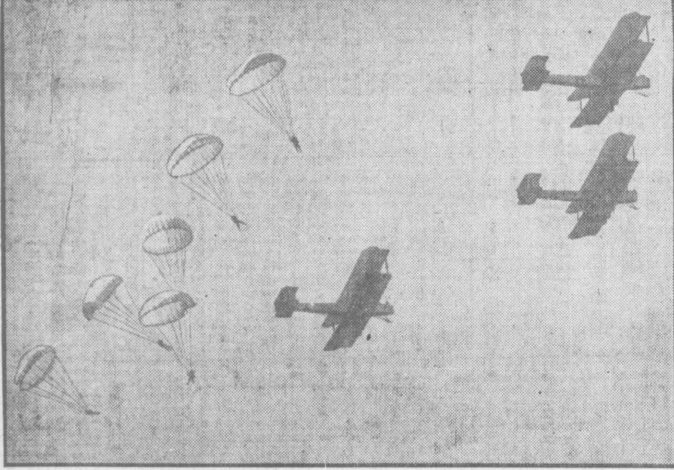

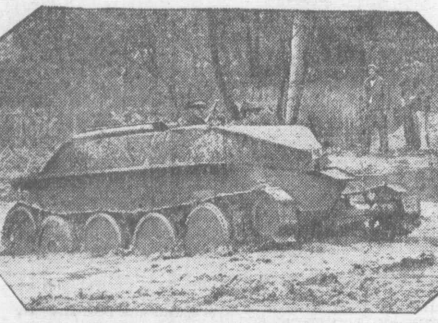

SAVANT REVEALS FAULTS IN FILIPINO IMMIGRATION

LOS ANGELES, July 26—(UP)—A serious inter-racial problem is facing the Pacific Coast because of the fact that most of the Filipinos entering this country are men, according to Social Research magazine by Dr. Emory S. Bogardus, chairman of the sociology department of the University of California.

Dr. Bogardus' article points out that there are practically no young Filipino women in the United States and that the Filipino men are without social connections among people of their own nationality.

"The inter-marriage situation is unique," he says. "In several states of the union, including Arizona, California, Idaho, Nevada, and Oregon Filipinos may not marry whites. Classed as Mongolians, they come under the marriage laws prohibiting inter-marriage of Mongolians and Caucasians. Although Malayan or partly Spanish, the Filipino is not Mongolian but may be classed as such.

JAPAN ARMY MAN RESIGNS

Murder Conspiracy Is Charged Against Guard Officer

Special to The Japanese American News TOKYO, July 31—Disclosure of a conspiracy to murder Takejiro Tokonami, veteran pilot, caused the retirement today of Lieutenant General Juichiro Yamaguchi, brigade chief of the Imperial Guards.

At a preliminary hearing, it was revealed that Yamaguchi had entrusted a military revolver into the hands of Yoshiye Abe with the instruction to kill Tokonami on alleged connection with the assassination of Chiang Tso-in, former Manchurian warlord. The Satsuma clan, which still plays an important role in the politics of the Empire, had come in possession of this conspiracy and published pamphlets in order to intrigue for the downfall of the Tanaka. The plan having failed, the Satsuma clique instituted a suit against Yamaguchi, and this eventually caused his retirement today.

BARON TANAKA: STATESMAN WHO NEVER GETS OFFENDED

A Character Sketch of the Retiring Seiyukai Premier Who Held Rein of Government of Japan for Three Years

General Baron Tanaka, the retiring Premier, is not a man of brains. He does not claim to be such a man, nor do the people believe him to be an intellectual gladiator. He is essentially a soldier—courageous, simple-minded, true to his friends, relentless in his foes and ready to sacrifice small things in an attempt to attain the greater goal.

Nearly all newspapers of the nation have been criticizing him for his unwise policies and his tenacity in sticking to his post. They think that the baron should have resigned long ago holding himself accountable for one thing or another that has occurred since he established the present ministry more than two years ago, and are surprised at his utter disregard for the public expectation. Many had anticipated that he would tender resignation to the Throne when a motion of censure was adopted almost unanimously by the House of Peers, but he did not. Many other incidents popped up which would have caused other ministries to quit, but our experimenter has remained unshaken as though he were a Daibutsu.

But the baron has been able to keep his position not because of his courage or strategy but because of his inborn virtue which in Japan is called "toku." He has not invited enmity despite his not infrequent political blunders because of his personal amiableness. As an individual, Baron Tanaka is a kindly person who can be an uncle to anybody. He is easy to be approached, or to talk to, and his provincial accent lends a peculiar charm to his speech, thereby making his hearers feel at home.

One cannot help smiling when he says anything. Usually he says obvious things and his unintellectual attitude towards persons has a peculiar psychological comfort for them. One of his habitual expressions is: "I haven't seen you for quite a while." He says this even to those he meets for the first time, because the expression has become a habit with him.

One day during his week-end visit to his villa at Katase, he had the pleasure of riding on a Fujiwara-Kamakura electric car which pleasure he had been prevented from enjoying by his secretaries and attendants. Like a little boy he was chatting with his secretaries when a drunken man recognized the tall figure of the statesman and saluted him to which the good-natured baron said: "How are you? I haven't seen you for a long time." This habit of his enormously pleased the drunken person, and when he returned to his village, he proclaimed the incident from house-tops, he himself became a member of the Seiyukai and urged his relatives and friends to do the same.

U. C. STARTS NEW SESSION NEXT AUG. 15

Japanese Frosh Urged To Apply for Club Accommodation

APPLY BY AUG. 5.
According to Miyamoto, all applications should be made before August 5, as none after that will be considered.

Applications have already been received from many upperclassmen, including students from U. C. L. A., Sacramento Junior College, Fresno State College, and U. S. C.

Nearly 150 Japanese students enrolled last term. Although 42 graduated in May, this number is expected to be compensated by the incoming freshmen and upperclassmen who will be transferred from other universities and colleges.

ACCOMMODATION FOR 33
The Japanese Student Club is at present headed by Tokio Katschi, a senior medical student from Stockton. The clubhouse was originally planned for accommodating twenty students, but the demand has been so great that provisions have been made to take in thirty-three.

There were thirty-three Japanese co-eds at the university, including those at the affiliated colleges in San Francisco. Out of this number eleven graduated in May. Only two San Francisco girls, Misses Michi Oka and Fumiko Murayama, are attending the university here.

TWO-WEEK PROGRAM

Prof. McKenzie will leave Japan shortly for China where he will visit Yenching University where a school of journalism will be opened this summer through a special arrangement entered into between Yenching and the School of Journalism of the University of Missouri. It is Prof. McKenzie's wish while here to enter into an arrangement with any of the leading universities in this country with a view of having the University of Washington assist in inaugurating a journalism teaching course here.

The visitor is an experienced newspaperman, having served on twenty-six different newspapers before occupying his present post. His last position before becoming dean of the School of Journalism of the University of Washington was associate editor in chief of the International Magazine Company, publishers of Cosmopolitan and Hearst's International.
