'LION' BANS GEISHA GIRLS

Premr. Hamaguchi Is Lonely Statesman Of Nippon

By LADY DRUMMOND-HAY The new Japanese Prime Minister, Mr. Yuiko Hamaguchi, disapproves of the geisha girls, and the age old Geisha system, so popular in Japan.

It is on record that only once in his life he spoke to a geisha.

I was in Tokyo on July 2, when the Selyukai Government of General Baron Tanaka fell, and the austere "Lion of Kuze" took over the helm of state of the Empire of Japan.

More silent than ever was President Coolidge, friendless, yet the idol of many, a lonely figure who seldom seeks the company of others, old, yet of extraordinary influence.

Mr. Hamaguchi is one of the most unique political characters in the Far East, where the political stage, and the figures moving on it, are often more interesting than our own, because they have an oriental touch that is intriguing to westerners.

POKER FACE The new premier's name—Hamaguchi—is that of the family who adopted him when he was a boy. He is called "the man without a smile" because of the rarity of his smiles—something most unusual among Japanese.

Known for his integrity, frugality, sincerity, and almost ascetic simplicity, disdainful of the arts of conversational or forensic conviction, and using only cold logical procedure, indifferent to the making of friends, paradoxical as it may seem there is yet a strange magnetism about the white-haired new premier that fascinates many.

In a city and a country where theater-going is extraordinarily popular, he has never been to a theater in all his 59 years.

In an interview once he remarked, "I am my own model." Certainly there is not a second figure like him in the political world of Japan, where unique characters are not rare: "A bear for work" an Americanized Japanese friend of his described him to me, adding, "He works—that's all." At one time he smoked heavily—more it is claimed than the War Chancellor.
