INUKAI HEADS SEIYU PARTY

TOKYO, Oct. 9.—Tsuoyoshi Inukai, veteran statesman and former Minister of Communication, has accepted the presidency of the Conservative party tendered him following the death of the late ex-Premier Baron Gichi Tanaka.

Inukai will return to Tokyo from Yakuwara hot springs on Oct. 11. He was unanimously favored for the position at a special meeting of the highest officials of the Conservative party held on Oct. 7.

The nomination of Inukai was due to the efforts on the part of the "Old Guards" to avoid a split in the party between the river factions headed by Takejiro Tokonami and Kiseburo Suzuki, both out of the presidency.

Inukai is considered a liberal Conservative. Taking advantage of his presidency the younger element of the Conservative party, under the leadership of such men as Zenbei Horikiri, Gichi Yamaguchi, and Tsunonoke Yamasaki, gathered together to pass resolutions demanding for a thorough democratization of the party.

Sanji Muto, president of the Kokumin Doshikai, today declared that under Inukai the Conservative party will experience a resurrection.

The Liberals, however, are dubious as to the results of what they termed a "patched-up" truce between the Tokonami and Suzuki factions. They see in this compromise nothing but a prolonging of the inevitable struggle which must await the party just as soon as Inukai resigns after serving for a time.

Portrait of Gifted Man

Genius defies both the camera and the creative portrait painter.

The gifted mind wears a thousand different garbs, and works among the system-makers who would pour mankind into a standardized pattern.

But, whether we are parent or pedagogue, we want to know early whether son or student is gifted or dull, and there are certain constants that can be looked for and found fairly indicative of the gifted or the dull mind.

The gifted mind usually bears the following marks:
RAPID THINKER
First, the gifted mind thinks quickly; it is blessed with the faculty of facile learning; it reads rapidly; it remembers effectively; facts, figures, and fancies etch themselves on the gifted mind with a clarity of outline and vividness of color that the dull mind never knows; it has the godlike gift of concentration, being able to build a castle wall around itself in the midst of clutter that would be bedlam to the dull mind; it can catch an idea on the fly.

Second, the gifted mind can stick at the job of thinking long without fatigue than the dull mind can; it is sustained, tenacious, and blessed with the blessing of endurance; it does not lose its wind easily.

POWER OF ORIGINALITY
Third, the gifted mind is prodded by a perpetual curiosity; it does not have to be cranked by external stimuli; it is a self-starter, which is a simple way of saying it has initiative; and it is original, being neither parrot nor peddler of second-hand ideas and inspirations.

Fourth, the gifted mind can see laws lurking behind little facts; it can generalize; it can see a principle at work behind a half dozen new stories dealing with a development in a given field of public affairs; it can relate things, ideas, forces, desires that are alike even though they may wear different dress and show
