WAKATSUKI, ABSOLVED OF BRIBE CHARGES, TO SAIL FOR SEATTLE ON NOV. 30

30 Planes and 20 Warships Will Give Send-
Off to Japanese Delegation — Cabinet's
Final Instructions Given Wakatsuki

TOKYO, Nov. 27—Absolved of all suspicion that he had taken part in a sensational bribery scandal, ex-Premier Reijo Wakatsuki, Japan's chief delegate to the forthcoming London naval conference, is making preparations for his departure on Nov. 30.

Minister of Justice Watanabe today published a formal report of the attorney general which completely exonerates Wakatsuki from charges lodged by his political enemies that he had conducted illegal transactions while a Premier of Japan.

Wakatsuki, together with his staff will board the N. Y. K. liner Siberia Maru for Seattle on Nov. 30.

More than thirty airplanes and ten warships will escort the Japanese delegation to the mouth of Tokyo Bay. The planes are from the naval air base at Oppama, and the ships are from the Yokosuka base.

TOKYO, Nov. 27—Several Japanese newspapers today published details that are generally considered to represent the government's desires for the London naval conference in January.

The chief principles of the Japanese program are said to be actual reduction instead of limitation of armaments, a 10-10-7 ratio for auxiliary ships and opposition to the abolition of or drastic reduction in submarine strength.

Other points include a demand for parity in submarines with Great Britain and the United States on the basis of 80,000 tons, with a maximum unit of 2000. Submarines under 600 tons would be exempted from limitation.

Japan would like to have 70 per cent of the American strength in eight-inch gun cruisers, to limit capital ships to 25,000 tons displacement and 14-inch guns, to restrict aircraft carriers to 20,000 tons and to fix the age limit of capital ships at twenty-five years, of cruisers to twenty years, of destroyers at sixteen years and of submarines at thirteen years.

SANCTION GIVEN

Furthermore, Japan would not attempt to alter the 60 per cent ratio for capital ships and aircraft carriers fixed at the Washington conference.

Japan's policy in the forthcoming conference, in the form of definite instructions for the guidance of delegates, received Emperor Hirohito's sanction this afternoon.

Premier Hamaguchi went to the Imperial Palace and presented the sovereign with a draft of the instructions as approved by the Cabinet council this morning.

Admiral Kanji Kato, chief of the naval general staff, accompanied the Premier and explained the instructions to the Emperor. Afterward they were formally delivered to Reijo Wakatsuki, chief delegate for Japan, and also were telegraphed to Ambassador Matsudaira in London for his guidance in further preliminary discussion with Prime Minister MacDonald.

WAKATSUKI CLEARED

With the fixing of the date of sailing for the delegation, which will leave on the liner Siberia Maru November 30, the government tonight quieted rumors which were circulated recently linking Wakatsuki's name to a certain railway scandal and causing a movement of some persons in influential quarters to force Wakatsuki to resign as chief delegate.


Viscount Watanabe Minister of Justice, issued a statement saying a thorough investigation by the Procurator General showed Wakatsuki blameless.

Naoake Sato, Minister representing Japan in the League of Nations, was named chief secretary to the Japanese delegation to London and departed for Europe this morning by way of Siberia.
