## U. S. OBTAINS ACCORD WITH JAPAN VIEWS

### So Declares Stimson After Last Parley With Wakatsuki

WASHINGTON, Dec. 19.—(UP)—Secretary of State Stimson announced today after his final conference with Japanese naval delegates that agreement in the American and Japanese objectives had been established.

#### ON WITH CONFERENCE

WASHINGTON, Dec. 19.—Arriving at the State Department at 10 a. m. today, the Japanese delegates resumed their conversations on naval reduction with Secretary Stimson, head of the American delegation to the London conference.

The conferees included Reijiro Wakatsuki, Admiral Takarabe, Ambassador Debutchi, and Hiroshi Salto for Japan, and Secretary Stimson, Ambassador Dwight Morrow, and Ambassador William Castle Jr. for the United States.

#### WITH PRES. HOOVER

WASHINGTON, Dec. 19.—After a brilliant White House dinner tonight President Hoover held his first conference with the Japanese delegation to the London armaments conference and discussed his views for reduction of naval armaments.

In addition to the Japanese envoys he had as guests at the dinner the American delegates to the conference, naval experts, and congressional leaders of the Republican and Democratic parties.

There was a frank discussion of the Japanese unwillingness to agree to scrap the capital ship without compensation in other classes of ships it is understood.

They also discussed their requirements for submarines, which they propose to build and which the British are anxious to have scrapped. It was altogether an informal discussion however, designed so that the two governments could understand the other's problems.

#### UNDERSTANDING

WASHINGTON, Dec. 19.—The question of Philippine independence was thrust into the foreground of American-Japanese conversations on disarmament today with the report from authoritative sources that tentative for a bilateral understanding in this direction were soon to be made.

Before their departure for London Saturday, former Premier Wakatsuki and Admiral-Minister Takarabe hope to have sketched in definite outline the frame of an American-Japanese "understanding."

## Japan Will Go into London Parley Prepared to Trade Submarine Tons For Cruisers on Her 10-10-7 Ratio

WASHINGTON, Dec. 19.—(UP)—Japan will go into the London conference prepared to trade submarine tons for cruisers, it was learned today as American and Japanese delegates continued their informal discussions here. The final Japanese-American meeting was scheduled for today.

Japan is understood to consider 78,000 tons of submarines necessary to her defense. But Tokyo considers allotment to Japan of 70 per cent of all auxiliary tonnage to be more important. If the London conference places the maximum submarine fleet at a figure which would make 78,000 tons exceed 70 per cent, Japan is understood to be willing to reduce small cruiser and destroyer tonnage. The present Japanese submarine strength is 78,487 tons, all but 6920 tons of which is built or building.

#### FRANCE HAS BIG FLEET

France maintains the world's largest submarine fleet, aggregating 90,098 tons, of which 73,068 tons would represent 70 per cent. After elimination of disposable craft, the next largest fleet is the British—78,331 tons of which 47,844 tons would represent 70 per cent. Whether Japan would insist upon computing her strength against the British or French submarine fleets would make a difference of more than 15,000 tons.

The Anglo-American argument against maintaining submarine fleets at their present levels will be that the submarines are not defensive, but offensive weapons. But to give this argument full force France must be persuaded to ratify the 1921 treaty in which the five powers agreed not to use submarines as commerce destroyers.

#### MEANS 237,000 TONS

Japan's demand for 70 per cent of the maximum cruiser tonnage approved by the London conference would represent 237,000 tons, estimated on the British requirements of 339,000 tons announced in London. American requirements are estimated at about 35,000 tons less.

In the event of the ultimate granting of independence to America's insular dominion.

Secretary of State Stimson, former governor general of the Philippines, is giving the delegates a luncheon tomorrow before their departure for New York. At that luncheon, or before it, the American and Japanese delegates to the five-power parley will have their last opportunity of exchange of ideas before the opening of the conference in London on January 21.

## MISS INABA, EX-CITIZEN, LOSES CASE

Divorcee Must Return To Nippon, Rules Federal Court

Upon the question of whether the legal status of Toshiko Inaba's estrangement from her erstwhile Japanese husband was an annulment or a divorce, will depend her right to remain in the United States.

This pretty 20-year-old woman who is a native of Walnut Grove, had lived in the State of eighteen years, after which she went to Japan and married a Japanese subject. Subsequently she was estranged from her husband, in a Japanese court, and then sought admission to the United States as an American citizen.

#### LOSES CITIZENSHIP

The Federal Circuit Court of Appeals ruled a few days ago, upholding the decision of Federal District Judge Louderback, that she must return to Japan. She had lost citizenship by virtue of having married an Oriental alien, and her subsequent estrangement from her husband does not give her her original citizenship status unless she could prove by a decree from the Japanese government that her marriage had been an annulment rather than a divorce.

If Toshiko Inaba could obtain the desired Japanese government's confirmation, she could petition for an appeal to the Supreme Court to test her case.

## WEBB GIVES OPINION ON ALIEN LAW

Leasing Of Property For Churches Is Not Possible

SACRAMENTO, Dec. 19.—(UP)—When Japanese are ineligible to citizenship they are prohibited by the alien land law and a treaty between America and Japan from leasing real estate for church purposes.

This opinion was held by Attorney General U. S. Webb today in reply to a question by State Real Estate Commissioner Stephen Barnson, in connection with an application by a Los Angeles real estate broker who wished to negotiate a lease of property for church purposes to an ineligible Japanese.

#### AN INDUSTRIALIZED SOUTH

The Southern sector of the United States is undergoing a rapid industrialization. In the race toward riches the South is several laps behind the Middle West.

The Middle West is far enough along in its industrialization for us to see the sort of social order that has resulted there from the impact of physical science and technological industry upon the older folkways of the Middle West's pre-industrial period.

Will the old South, as its industrialization goes on, become simply another Middle West? Will the South, as it becomes more and more an industrialized section, repeat the cultural story of the Middle West, so that, for the next twenty-five years, we shall see the South coming along, twenty-five years behind the schedule, and going through the same stages of cultural as well as industrial development experienced by the Middle West during the last twenty-five years?

I hope not, and I do not think so. Unless the South chooses to follow the lunatic fringe of its forces of

Mary and Doug arrived at Kobe last Monday. They will enter Tokyo today at 4 p. m. They are scheduled to leave Yokohama tomorrow for America aboard the N. Y. K. liner Asama Maru at 3 p. m. On the same day Kameyama Sojin, Hollywood's Japanese actor, will arrive at Yokohama aboard the S. S. Tenyo Maru.

## Japan Will Not Formally Indict Former Minister

TOKYO, Dec. 19.—Following a close cross-examination today, the district attorney's office decided not to place a formal indictment against Ichiro Kobaishi, former Minister of Education, for his alleged participation in a bribe scandal. The reason for this non-indictment is based on two grounds: that due to conflicting testimonies the prosecution will be unable to secure sufficient evidence to convict him; and that his resignation from the Cabinet post is in itself sufficient punishment for his alleged mis-deed.

The prosecution also decided today not to indict Mototaro Furuhata, a leader of the Liberal party who has also been charge with complicity in the crime.


