GIRL, 17, IS MISTREATED

So Hints Confession By Alleged Victim At Glenville

GLENVILLE, Dec. 21.—A threatening letter found in the automobile of a Japanese girl student and her subsequent admission led to the arrest of two traffic officers and a policeman here in a case of alleged attempt to contribute to the delinquency of a minor.

The girl, a 17-year old student of Hoover High School, told the police that she was caught by a traffic officer for speeding and that she had accepted the offer to be pardoned on the condition that she consent to "date" with him. Then when she kept her promise in a nearby canyon, she was mistreated, she told the police.

Two more "dating" letters were received, which contained veiled threats to secrecy, and these led to the arrest of the two traffic officers and a policeman. Further investigations are now under way.
